On Monday, March 28, 2011, the Transportation Conference Subcommittee completed its work. We are pleased to present this report which provides details on budget matters agreed to by the Subcommittee.

The Subcommittee agrees to the Executive's proposed State Operations, Aid to Localities and Capital Projects appropriations for the Department of Transportation and additional authorization for the utilization of unused Airport Improvement Program funds for the Airport Improvement and Revitalization Grant and Loan Program, the Executive's proposed State Operations, Aid to Localities and Capital Projects appropriations for the Department of Motor Vehicles, the Executive's proposed Aid to Localities appropriations for the Metropolitan Transportation Authority, and the Executive's proposed Capital Projects appropriations for the Thruway Authority.

The Subcommittee agrees on the following actions in relation to Article VII proposals:

- Provide \$39.7 million in Marchiselli funding, and \$363.097 million for the CHIPs program and accept the Executive's language related thereto.
- Permanently extend the State DOT Single Audit program.
- Permanently extend the law relating to the suspension of drivers' licenses pending prosecution of certain alcohol offenses.
- Permanently extend the law relating to the suspension of drivers' licenses for certain drug-related offenses.
- Permanently extend laws relating to motor vehicle financial security requirements.
- Amend provisions of law relating to commercial vehicle operators to ensure the continued receipt of \$35 million in federal highway aid this year.
