## NEW YORK STATE CLEAN WATER STATE REVOLVING FUND (CWSRF) FOR WATER POLLUTION CONTROL

**Objective:** Provides low interest rate loans to municipalities to finance the planning, design and construction of water pollution control facilities. These include treatment works projects such as: sanitary sewers; wastewater pumping facilities; wastewater treatment facilities; infiltration/inflow correction; sewer replacement; combined sewer overflow abatement; and storm sewer pollution control; and nonpoint source pollution control projects such as: landfill capping and closure; airport deicing pollution control; highway deicing material storage facilities; stormwater management facilities; brownfields remediation; remediation of leaking storage tanks and municipal hazardous waste sites; streambank stabilization and erosion control; restoration of water bodies; and land purchase or conservation easements for water quality protection.

**Eligibility:** Counties, Cities, Towns, Villages, District Corporations, County and Town Improvement Districts, Indian Reservations wholly within New York State and eligible Public Benefit Corporations and Public Authorities, and any Agency of New York State which is empowered to construct and operate an eligible project. In addition, financing can be provided to Not-for-Profit organizations for land acquisition for water quality protection.

**Type of Program and Special Restrictions:** Projects must comply with Federal and State requirements. Limited to eligible activities associated with the protection or improvement of water quality, i.e., construction of wastewater treatment facilities, non-point source projects and estuary plan development or implementation.

**Action Required to Receive Aid:** Submission of a Technical, Planning or Engineering Report and a complete loan application. Must be listed in the annual Intended Use Plan which contains a prioritized list of projects from communities expected to apply for a CWSRF loan.

**Flow of Funds:** State to Local. Monies are disbursed as costs are incurred.

**Type of Aid:** Project Loan or Debt Purchase. This program provides low interest loans, rather than grants-in-aid. Funds are made available from Federal and State sources. Loan repayments and interest earnings provide a perpetual source of funding for future projects.

**Formula:** Funds are distributed on a priority basis with consideration for water quality benefit, public health and community size. Communities facing financial hardship may be eligible for reduced interest loans.

## NEW YORK STATE DRINKING WATER STATE REVOLVING FUND (DWSRF)

**Objective:** Provides financial assistance to public and private community water systems, and non-profit non-community water systems for the capital costs of drinking water facilities and infrastructure improvements. These projects include investments to upgrade or replace infrastructure, projects to achieve or maintain compliance with federal or state health standards, and provide the public with safe affordable drinking water. Examples of such projects are rehabilitation or development of new drinking water sources to replace contaminated supplies; installation or upgrade of treatment facilities to ensure compliance with state and federal drinking water standards or treatment/performance criteria; installation or upgrade of storage facilities, including finished water reservoirs, to prevent microbiological contamination or to provide adequate delivery pressures; installation or replacement of transmission and distribution mains to prevent contamination caused by leaks or breaks; funding and/or construction to promote the consolidation of water supply services, particularly in circumstances where individual homes or water systems generally have an inadequate quantity of water, the water supply is contaminated, or the system is unable to maintain adequate compliance for financial or managerial reasons; and the purchase of a portion of another system if the purchase is part of a consolidation plan to bring the system(s) into compliance. Any of the above listed project types which are publicly owned and which were previously financed after July 1, 1993, may be eligible for refinancing.

**Eligibility:** Drinking water systems that are eligible for project funding are community water systems, both public and privately owned, and non-profit, non-community water systems. Projects submitted by systems lacking technical, managerial or financial capacity or significant non-compliers are not eligible for funding unless the proposed project will improve capacity or compliance. Also, projects whose primary purpose is fire protection or growth/development, dams and reservoirs, or acquisition of land not integral to an eligible project are not eligible.

**Type of Program and Special Restrictions:** Projects financed by the DWSRF must satisfy applicable federal and State requirements. Limited to eligible activities associated with the construction of drinking water facilities and infrastructure improvements.

**Action Required to Receive Aid:** Must be listed on the annual Intended Use Plan which contains a prioritized ranking of projects, scored on health-based criteria, expected to apply for a DWSRF loan. Projects eligible to receive financing during a funding cycle must have a priority ranking score above the funding line based on financial capacity of the program. Submission of complete loan application by those communities is required.

**Description of Aid:**

**Flow of Funds:** State to Local. Funds are disbursed as costs are incurred. For hardship projects receiving grant funds, loan proceeds are disbursed before grant.

**Type of Aid:** Low interest loans, zero interest financial hardship loans, and financial hardship grants.

**Formula:** Funds are distributed on a priority basis using health-based criteria. Communities facing financial hardship may be eligible for reduced-interest loans and grants, using health-based and financial criteria.
