2013 Long Island Somos El Futuro Black-Brown Alliance Conference

Assemblyman Ramos organizes first-ever event in Suffolk



Assemblyman Phil Ramos recently organized the first-ever Somos El Futuro Black-Brown Alliance Conference in Suffolk County. The goal of the event, said Ramos, "is to build a coalition among Long Island's growing minority community, which is approximately 35 percent of the region's population." Over 1,200 participants from in and around Long Island attended this year's Black-Brown Alliance Conference. The conference is scheduled to be an annual event and is expected to grow in attendance and influence.

The Somos El Futuro conference was a byproduct of the creation of the New York State Assembly/Senate Puerto Rican/Hispanic Task Force in 1987. For the past 26 years the task force has mobilized Hispanics in an effort to focus attention to issues of importance to communities across the state. In the presence of the ever-growing minority community on Long Island, it was only natural that political leaders, community leaders and private and nonprofit sectors got together to bring attention and work on the issues of utmost importance to the minority community of Long Island.

Workshops were held on issues ranging from education to the changing demographics on Long Island. The conference also served as a stage to highlight the contributions made by minorities on Long Island in the areas of education, business, politics and immigration reform.

STAR Registration Program

Notice from Assemblyman Ramos on new tax law

A new law now requires all homeowners receiving a Basic STAR exemption to register with the New York State Tax Department in order to receive the exemption in 2014 and succeeding years. Homeowners will not have to register to receive their

2013 STAR exemption. There will be no need to re-register every year. The Tax Department will monitor homeowners' eligibility for future years based on the information provided during the registration process.

There are two ways to register - online and by phone.

To register online go to http://www.tax.ny.gov/pit/property/star13/.You will need to:

- ★ provide a STAR code (the Department of Taxation and Finance are mailing codes to all Basic STAR recipients; or you can use the STAR code lookup online)
- ★ provide the names and social security numbers for all owners of the property and spouses
- ★ confirm that the property is the primary residence of one of its owners (married couples with multiple residences may only claim one STAR exemption)
- ★ confirm that the combined income of the owners and their spouses who reside at the property does not exceed \$500,000
- \star confirm that no resident owner received a residency-based tax benefit from another state

- ★ Monday Friday from 8:30 a.m. 8:00 p.m.
- ★ Saturdays between 9:00 a.m. 1:00 p.m.

Registration runs now through December 31, 2013.
