Lowering taxes, protecting homeowners

Long Island has some of the highest property taxes in the state, making it difficult for families to stay and raise their children here.

- ✓ Extended the property tax cap for four more years to keep taxes in check (Ch. 20 of 2015).
- ✓ Secured over \$3 billion for property tax rebate checks for working families (Ch. 20 of 2015).

Too many homeowners are still struggling to afford necessary repairs and increased property taxes following Superstorm Sandy.

- ✓ Provided property tax relief to families repairing or rebuilding homes damaged by the storm to help keep life affordable (Ch. 122 of 2015).

New York residents pay some of the highest utility rates in the country.

- ✓ Sponsored legislation to create a Utility Consumer Advocate, an independent voice that would protect our families from unfair rate hikes (A.180).




