Assemblyman Braunstein takes step to strip pensions from corrupt politicians

"We should have zero tolerance for corruption in government," said Assemblyman Braunstein. "That's why I voted in favor of a resolution to amend the New York State Constitution that provides for the stripping of pensions for public officials convicted of a felony related to their official duties. Politicians who betray the public trust and use their office to line their own pockets shouldn't be rewarded with pension benefits paid for by taxpayers.

"Unfortunately, those who serve in government sometimes forget what public service is all about and help themselves instead of their constituents," said Assemblyman Braunstein. "Politicians aren't above the law, and this legislation makes clear that there are serious consequences when they commit a crime. If you defraud the people, we'll defund your pension."

More than 250 seniors attended Assemblyman Braunstein's forum, which included a free lunch, and featured guest speakers Ann-Margaret Carrozza, Esq. and Dr. William Duke. In addition, participants at the forum included AgeWell New York; Comptroller Thomas P. DiNapoli's Office of Unclaimed Funds; Kinray, a Cardinal Health Company; New York City Department of Finance; Northwell Health's Division of Geriatric and Palliative Medicine; Parker Jewish Institute for Health Care and Rehabilitation; and Services Now for Adult Persons. The Queens County Dental Society provided free dental hygiene products for the attendees.



At the forum, Assemblyman Braunstein presented Selfhelp Clearview Senior Center with a \$500,000 grant for upgrades to the building's lobby and auditorium, heating improvements, and a new handicapped accessible walkway.
