Upcoming Voter Registration Deadlines

November 7, 2017 General Election Deadlines

- Mail Registration: postmarked by October 13th & received by October 18th.
- In Person Registration: October 13th
- Change of Address: October 19th

- <u>Absentee Ballot</u>: Postmark <u>application</u> by October 31st or apply in-person by November 6th. Postmark the <u>ballot</u> by November 6th (received by November 15th). Deliver in-person ballot by November 7th (someone other than voter).

Change of Enrollment: An application to change one's party enrollment for 2018 must be received by October 13th, 2017.

To register to vote, you may pick up a voter registration form at my district office, or go to the BOE website to download the form and explore other registration options.
