Ensuring a future home for the Bronx Children's Museum

Beginning in 2006 as a series of traveling programs, the Bronx Children's Museum is an educational initiative that has garnered widespread support from the community. Its Museum on the Go Bus is recognizable to all Bronxites that have seen its insightful exhibits in our community.

The Museum is preparing to move into its new home in 2017 at Kids Powerhouse Discovery Center, a building situated in Mill Pond Park.

However, New York City officials have noted that there is a need to alienate City park land or separate this land from the municipality's jurisdiction. This will ensure that the Bronx Children's Museum is able to post signage on the building being used to house the Museum.

Legislation:

Assembly Bill A.8120: An act to authorize the Commissioner of Parks and Recreation of the City of New York to enter into an agreement for the operation of a children's program known as the Bronx Children's Museum in a portion of a building located in Mill Pond Park in the Borough of the Bronx.

Message from Assemblywoman Joyner:
