Amy Paulin: Passing laws that make Westchester stronger

During the past legislative year, Assemblywoman Paulin authored nine bills that have become law. Those laws:

- Help victims of domestic violence become more financially independent by prohibiting employers from discriminating against them (Ch. 80 of 2009).
- Protect children who have been sexually abused from being badgered in court when they testify (Ch. 485 of 2009).
- Allow Westchester County to sell bonds electronically, which will enable taxpayers to keep more of their hard-earned money (Ch. 304 of 2009).
- Increase the property tax exemption for Cold War veterans (Ch. 235 of 2009).

- Ensure the euthanizing of animals be done in a humane and compassionate manner (Ch. 479 of 2009).
- Help ensure that every vote gets counted in an election (Ch. 40 of 2009).
- Mandate Election Day workers to inform voters of their proper polling places (Ch. 489 of 2009).
- Upgrade safety requirements at summer camps that conduct indoor activities (Ch. 439 of 2009).
- Implement a proper retirement plan for a local police officer (Ch. 434 of 2009).
