## **She ensured that our state budget:**

- Cuts taxes for middle-class families, which will result in average savings of \$700 per year per taxpayer once fully implemented
- Improves local infrastructure, including \$1.7 million through PAVE NY and \$7.7 million through CHIPs to repair and upgrade our roads and bridges in Saratoga and Washington counties
- Provides \$300 million for the Environmental Protection Fund, the largest funding commitment in its history, to identify and prevent water contamination, preserve and protect open space and family farms, revitalize waterfronts, and build community parks

- Invests \$5 million for county fairground improvements, including those in Saratoga and Washington counties, to upgrade facilities and expand accessibility
- Supports the Hudson-Hoosic Rivers Partnership with \$250,000 that will go toward building the new Partnership Gateway Visitors Center in Schuylerville
- Strengthens New York farms with nearly \$31 million for agriculture programs, including over \$11 million in restorations and increases to the Future Farmers of America, New York Maple Producers Association, New York Christmas Tree Farmers, and other agricultural organizations
