


East 72nd Street Neighborhood Association President Valerie Mason Shares Her Vision for Council District 5 with Our Town

"We need the Council to come out and support what local communities want vis-a-vis development. We need their support to help us make the city planning commission listen to what community boards are advocating on behalf of their constituents. East 50s [rezoning] and Community Board 8 resolution to limit height to 210 feet are two examples.

Council also needs to be active on issues relating to transportation, bike safety issues being a priority. How are bike lanes, bus-only lanes, creation of pedestrian malls and the influx of Uber and Lyft-type services adding to congestion? Transportation also includes making our sidewalks safe for pedestrians with as much room for them as possible.

- 2. Projects must have been substantially completed between December 1, 2016 and December 1, 2017.
- 3. Only the exteriors of architectural projects and/or historically significant interiors will be considered.
- 4. Preservation projects should be for restoration, rehabilitation, or adaptive re-use of historic buildings (including Post World War II architecture). The buildings may be located either in or out of the historic districts.
- 5. New construction is also eligible.
- 6. Individuals or advocacy groups must have contributed to the preservation of the Upper East Side's built environment.
