Hepatitis C is known as a "silent killer"

Assemblyman Jeffrey Dinowitz helped pass a law requiring hospitals to offer Hepatitis C testing to patients born between 1945 and 1965 (Ch. 425 of 2013).



According to the NYS Department of Health, as many as 150,000 New Yorkers are unaware they are infected with Hepatitis C.

75% of infections occur within adults born between 1945 and 1965.1

The good news is that, if caught early enough, Hepatitis C is treatable.

Chronic Hepatitis C can lead to liver problems, including cancer.
