Eligibility: Counties and Cities.

Type of Program and Special Restrictions: Mandated, required by State law or regulations.

Action Required to Receive Aid: For Ch. 825, 687 and 213, non-competitive applications for aid are required. For Ch. 686 aid is by contract.

#### **Description of Aid:**

Flow of Funds: State to Local. Monies are provided on a current fiscal year basis for interest payments and appellate costs, and pursuant to contract for cleaning and minor repairs.

**Type of Aid:** Project Grant and Ongoing

**Formulas:** Percentage of expenditures by local governments for aided purposes. Ranges: 25-33 percent for interest. Aid percentage within range established by relative taxing capacity: factors are population and value of taxable property. One hundred percent of expenses associated with appellate courts are reimbursable. Beginning in 1998-99, there is a four year phase-in beginning at 25% and going to 100% in SFY 2001-02 for cleaning and minor repair costs.

Matching Requirement: See formulas.

Maintenance of Effort: See formulas. Also requires compliance with M&O standards and capital plan.

**Comments:** Program provides subsidies to counties and cities for what was heretofore entirely a local cost. Subsidy moneys come from a Special Revenue Fund into which certain legal fees are deposited.
