Preliminary Estimate of 2005-06 and 2006-07 State Aids Payable Under Section 3609 Plus Other Aids

COMBINED AIDS

2005-06 Base Year Aids:

For 2005-06 Aid, the Actual Valuation (AV) of taxable real property for purposes of determining a district's property wealth per pupil is defined as the 2002 AV. The State average of the 2002 AV per 2003-04 Total Wealth Pupil Unit (TWPU) is \$346,400. Similarly, income wealth is based on the 2002 Adjusted Gross Income of residents of the district, as reported on State income tax returns and including the results of the statewide computerized income verification process, divided by the TWPU of the district. This is compared to the State average of \$118,500. The two measures taken together constitute the district's Combined Wealth Ratio (CWR), which is used in determining aid ratios for many formulas. Some formulas use the Resident Weighted Average Daily Attendance (RWADA) wealth ratio; the State average 2002 AV per 2003-04 RWADA is \$413,300. Transportation Aid uses the Enrollment (Resident Public and Nonpublic Enrollment) wealth ratio; the State average is \$360,300.

Flex Aid + Addl Aids: The sum of 2005-06 Flex Aid and Additional Aids.

Flex Aid is the sum of: (1) Tier 1 Flex Aid which is the sum of 2004-05 Comprehensive Operating, Extraordinary Needs, Educationally Related Support Services, Limited English Proficiency, Summer School and Maintenance and Repair Aids; (2) Tier 2 Flex Aid which is Flex Selected TAPU multiplied by the sum of \$6 and the result of \$55 multiplied by the Geographic Cost of Education Index-based cost adjustment multiplied by the aid ratio (1.37 - (1.10 * Flex CWR), maximum .90, minimum .05); (3) Aid Due Minimum or Cap which guarantees the district's Tier 1 and 2 Flex Aids are no more than a Flex CWR-adjusted 2.5 percent increase over Tier 1 Flex Aid and no less than a 0.5 percent increase over the Tier 1 Flex Aid; and (4) Tier 3 Flex Aid which, for districts with a Flex CWR less than 1.20 and a Free and Reduced Price Lunch (FRPL) percent greater than 50 percent, is \$9 multiplied by the FRPL Index (i.e., FRPL percent divided by 50 percent) multiplied by the aid ratio (1 - (.64 * Flex CWR), minimum .10) multiplied by 2004-05 public school enrollment. Flex Selected TAPU includes weightings of 0.33 for Free and Reduced Price Lunch, LEP and Sparsity pupil counts. The GCEI-based cost adjustment is a statewide index reflecting variations in teacher compensation among school districts. The index for each district is listed under the heading "Tier 1 Flex Aids" in the school aid computer listing entitled "Flex Aid, Instructional Materials Aids and Sound Basic Education Aid" produced by the Commissioner of Education in support of the Executive Budget request for the 2005-06 school year and entitled "BT033-1.

Additional Aids are equal to the sum of Tier 2 Comprehensive Operating Aid (COA) plus, for each of Educationally Related Support Services Aid, Extraordinary Needs Aid, Limited English Proficiency Aid, Summer School Aid and Maintenance and Repair Aid, the positive result of the apportionment calculated for 2005-06 minus the lesser of 2004-05 aid as shown on the 2005-06 Executive Budget computer run BT0331 or the appropriation calculated for 2004-05. Tier 2 2005-06 COA is the product of \$109.40 multiplied by the Tier 2 COA aid ratio (1.30 - (1.85 * CWR), with a minimum of .00 and a maximum of 1.0) multiplied by Selected TAPU.

<u>Growth:</u> The 2005-06 Growth Aid claimed is the district's 2005-06 enrollment-based Growth Index in excess of 1.004 multiplied by the 2005-06 Formula Operating Aid.

Full Day K Conversion: Full Day Kindergarten Conversion Aid is provided to eligible districts.

<u>Tax Limitation</u>: The 2005-06 aid claimed by districts is the sum of 2004-05 Tax Limitation Aid plus, for districts with a Combined Wealth Ratio below 1.5 and a Residential Levy Income

Ratio above 1.6 percent, an additional tier 2 of aid. Tier 2 aid equals \$109.80 multiplied by the Residential Levy Income Ratio multiplied by the Tax Limitation Aid Ratio (1-(.5*CWR)) multiplied by the Pupils for Tax Aid. The Residential Levy Income Ratio is the 2002 Residential Tax Levy with condominiums divided by the 2002 Adjusted Gross income, with the result divided by 0.0257. Tier 3 Tax Limitation Aid is Selected TAPU multiplied by the positive result of 2003-04 AOE/TAPU for Expense minus \$8,500 multiplied by the Tax Limitation Aid Ratio (1-(.5*CWR)) multiplied by 0.90. Aid is the sum of 2004-05 Tax Limitation Aid plus 2005-06 tier 2 and tier 3 Tax Limitation Aids.

- <u>BOCES + Special Services:</u> The 2005-06 BOCES Aid claimed for administrative, shared services, rent and capital expenses plus any Due Save-harmless Aid. Special Services Aid is the sum of Career Education Aid and Computer Administration Aid claimed in 2005-06 by non-components of BOCES including the Big 5 City school districts.
- Excess Cost: Public + Private: The 2005-06 Public Excess Cost Aid, based on 2003-04 Approved Operating Expense/TAPU for Expense in the range of \$2,000 to \$8,500, claimed for students with disabilities attending public schools or BOCES including any aid due to the minimum guarantee. Excess Cost Aid for students in integrated settings is the product of excess cost aid per pupil multiplied by 50 percent of the attendance of 2003-04 pupils who receive special services or programs by qualified personnel, consistent with an IEP, for 60 percent or more of the school day in a general education classroom with nondisabled students. The 2005-06 Private Excess Cost Aid claimed for public school students attending private schools for students with disabilities for whom the district pays tuition.
- Building + Bldg Reorg Incent: Aidable building expenses are for leases, certain capital outlay exceptions, certain refinancing costs and an assumed debt service payment based on the useful life of the project and an average interest rate. Building Aid equals approved building expenses, multiplied by the greater of the Current AV/RWADA Aid Ratio or the Aid Ratio selected for payment of building aid in the 2004-05 school year. For projects approved on or after July 1, 2000, expenses are multiplied by the higher of the Building Aid Ratio used for 1999-00 Aid less .10 or the Current AV/RWADA Aid Ratio or, for eligible projects, the low income aid ratio. Up to 10 percent of additional building aid is provided for projects approved on or after July 1, 1998. Reorganization Incentive Building Aid is 25 percent of Approved Building Aid for qualifying reorganized school districts (or 30 percent for districts reorganized since July 1, 1983). The sum of Building and Incentive Building Aid is limited to 95 percent of approved expenses. Aid is not provided for those prospective and deferred projects that had not fully met all eligibility requirements as of the February 15, 2005 database.
- Reorg. Incentive (Operating): Reorganization Incentive Operating Aid is up to 20 percent of Formula Operating Aid for districts reorganized from July 1, 1983 to June 30, 1992 and 40 percent since then. The sum of Formula Operating Aid and Incentive Operating Aid is limited to 95 percent of 2003-04 Approved Operating Expense.
- <u>Transportation incl. Summer:</u> The 2004-05 approved non-capital transportation expense multiplied by the selected transportation aid ratio with a .9 maximum and a .065 minimum. Aid on Capital expenses is computed as above, but based on the assumed amortization of the aidable purchase, lease or equipment expenses over five years, at a statewide average interest rate. Transportation Aid for district operated summer school programs is prorated to total no more than \$5.0 million statewide.
- <u>Hardware & Technology:</u> The aid that can be claimed by the district in 2005-06 for Instructional Computer Hardware expenses (acquisition and limited repair expenses) is equal to the lesser of 2004-05 expenses or \$19.25 multiplied by the Selected TAPU for aid payable in 2005-06 multiplied by the 2005-06 Hardware Aid Ratio (1 .51 * RWADA wealth ratio). Some districts may receive no aid.
- Software, Library, Textbook: Software Aid is the lesser of approved 2004-05 expenditures or \$14.98 multiplied by the combined 2004-05 public plus nonpublic school enrollment for pupils attending school in the district plus district pupils attending full time BOCES and private school programs for students with disabilities plus pupils attending the State operated schools at Rome and Batavia and resident pupils placed in Special Act school districts. Library Materials Aid is the lesser of approved 2004-05 expenditures or \$6.00 multiplied by the pupil count for Software Aid. Textbook Aid, including Lottery Aid for textbook purchases, is the lesser of approved 2004-05 expenditures or \$57.30 multiplied by the 2004-05 enrollment of resident public plus resident nonpublic pupils plus resident pupils

with disabilities attending approved private schools or the State operated schools at Rome and Batavia and resident pupils placed in Special Act school districts. Charter school enrollments are included in the pupil counts.

<u>Universal Prekindergarten:</u> The Universal Prekindergarten Grants as claimed for 2005-06.

Early Grade Class Size Redn: The Early Grade Class Size Reduction Grants as claimed for 2005-06.

<u>Teacher Support Aid:</u> Teacher Support grants are to support teacher salaries in the Big 5 City school districts.

2005-06 Sound Basic Education Aid: The 2005-06 Sound Basic Education Aid as shown on the Executive Budget computer run BT033-1. This aid is the sum of English Language Learners Aid, Economically Disadvantaged Student Aid and Sparsity Aid, however, no district receives less than \$25,000. English Language Learners Aid is the product of \$715 multiplied by the GCEI-based cost adjustment multiplied by the Aid Ratio (1.0 - (.40 * CWR) minimum .05) multiplied by LEP pupils weighted at 0.20. Economically Disadvantaged Student Aid is the product of \$715 plus, if enrollment per square mile is greater than 1,200, \$60, with the result multiplied by the GCEI-based cost adjustment multiplied by the Aid Ratio (1.0 - (.40 * CWR), minimum .05) multiplied by economically disadvantaged pupils weighted at 0.35. If enrollment per square mile is less than 25, Sparsity Aid equals \$95 multiplied by the GCEI-based cost adjustment multiplied by the Sparsity Factor (25 - enrollment per square mile, divided by 58) multiplied by economically disadvantaged pupils weighted at0.35. Economically disadvantaged pupils are based on the FRPL percent and 2004-05 public enrollment.

Total: Sum of the above Aids.

2006-07 Estimated Aids:

For 2006-07 Aid, the Selected Actual Valuation (AV) of taxable real property for purposes of determining a district's property wealth per pupil is defined as the lesser of 2003 AV or 117 percent of the 2002 AV. The State average of the 2003 AV per 2004-05 Total Wealth Pupil Unit (TWPU) is \$382,200. Income wealth is based on 2003 Adjusted Gross Income of residents of the district, as reported on tax returns and including the results of the statewide computerized income verification process, divided by the TWPU of the district. This is compared to the State average of \$121,800. The AV and Income Wealth ratios are used equally to compute the district's Combined Wealth Ratio (CWR). Some formulas use the Resident Weighted Average Daily Attendance (RWADA) wealth ratio; the State average Selected AV per 2004-05 RWADA is \$456,700. Transportation Aid uses the Enrollment (Resident Public and Nonpublic Enrollment) wealth ratio; the State average is \$397,600.

<u>Flex Aid:</u> The 2006-07 Flex Aid includes a 1 percent increase in the sum of the 2005-06 Flex Aid + Additional Aids.

Supplemental ENA: For districts with a CWR below 0.805, tier 1 Supplemental Extraordinary Needs Aid (ENA) equals \$207.50 multiplied by the formula operating state sharing ratio multiplied by selected TAPU for payment multiplied by the sum of an extraordinary needs (EN) aid ratio (.805 - CWR) plus a sparsity adjustment. The sparsity adjustment is the positive result of (25 - 2005 public school enrollment /square mile) divided by 68. For districts with a CWR, computed with data on file as of February, 2006, greater than 0.975 and an EN percent greater than 35 percent, tier 2 aid is the result of \$125 multiplied by selected TAPU for payment multiplied by the positive result of the EN percent minus 15 percent. Tier 3 aid is the result of \$45.40 plus an additional ceiling multiplied by the extraordinary needs pupil count, which is composed of limited English proficient pupils, a poverty count (based on the percent of K-6 eligible applicants for the free and reduced-price lunch program) and a sparsity count.

<u>Limited English Proficiency:</u> Pupils with Limited English Proficiency (i.e., scoring below the 40th percentile on a standard test of English proficiency and receiving LEP services) multiplied by 5.6 percent of the 2006-07 Formula Operating Aid/Selected TAPU.

Enrollment Adjustment Aid: The product of \$1,725 and the Selected State Sharing Ratio is multiplied by the positive result of 2004 enrollment minus 2000 enrollment.

- <u>Growth:</u> The district's estimated enrollment-based Growth Index in excess of 1.004 multiplied by the estimated 2006-07 Formula Operating Aid.
- <u>Full Day K Conversion:</u> Districts with any half-day kindergarten or no kindergarten programs in 1996-97 and in the base year are eligible for Full Day K Conversion Aid equal to the estimated 2006-07 Formula Operating Aid/Selected TAPU multiplied by the increase in full day kindergarten enrollment in the current year over the prior year. School districts must offer full day programs to all kindergarten students in order to qualify for this aid.
- Tax Limitation: Districts receive 2005-06 Tax Limitation Aid plus, two new tiers of aid. For districts with a Combined Wealth Ratio below 2.0 and a Residential Levy Income Ratio above 1.8 percent, Tier 2 aid equals \$50.00 multiplied by the Residential Levy Income Ratio multiplied by the Tax Limitation Aid Ratio (1 (.48* CWR)) multiplied by the Pupils for Tax Aid. The Residential Levy Income Ratio is the 2003 Residential Tax Levy with condominiums divided by the 2003 Adjusted Gross Income, with the result divided by 0.0278. Tier 3 Tax Limitation Aid is Selected TAPU multiplied by the positive result of 2004-05 AOE/TAPU for Expense minus \$9,250, multiplied by the Tier 3 Tax Limitation Aid Ratio (1 (.465 * CWR)) multiplied by 0.1332. Aid is the sum of 2005-06 Tax Limitation Aid plus 2006-07 tier 2 and tier 3 Tax Limitation Aids.
- BOCES + Special Services: BOCES Aid for administrative, shared services, rental and capital expenses plus Aid Due Save-Harmless. Approved expense for BOCES Administrative and Shared Services Aids is based on a salary limit of \$30,000. Aid is based on approved 2005-06 administrative and service expenses and the higher of the millage ratio or the Current AV/2004-05 RWADA Aid Ratio: (1 - (.51 * RWADA Wealth Ratio)) with a .36 minimum and .90 maximum. Rent and Capital Aids are based on 2006-07 expenses multiplied by the Current AV/RWADA Aid ratio with a .00 minimum and a .90 maximum. Payable Aid is the sum of these aids including save-harmless. Special Services Aid, for non-components of BOCES including the Big 5 City school districts, is the sum of Career Education Aid and Computer Administration Aid. Career Education Aid equals the Aid Ratio (1 - (.59 * CWR), with a .36 minimum) multiplied by \$3,900, multiplied by the 2005-06 Career Education pupils including the pupils in business and marketing sequences weighted at .16. Computer Administration Aid equals the Aid Ratio (1 - (.51 * CWR), with a .30 minimum) multiplied by approved expenses not to exceed the maximum of \$62.30 multiplied by the Fall 2005 public school enrollment by district of attendance with half-day kindergarten weighted at 1.0.
- Excess Cost: Public + Priv: Public Excess Cost: District 2004-05 Approved Operating Expense/TAPU for Expense, for aid purposes, is in a \$2,000 to \$9,250 range. The aid per pupil equals the allowed expense times the Aid Ratio (1 - (.51 * CWR), with a .25 minimum). A 1.65 weighting is provided for students who require special services or programs for 60 percent or more of the school day consistent with an Individualized Education Program (IEP). High Cost expense must exceed the lesser of \$10,000 or four times district AOE/TAPU for Expense. Declassification Aid is included based on 50 percent of the basic Public Excess Cost aid per pupil. No district receives less than 95 percent of its 2005-06 Aid. In addition to the above, Excess Cost Aid for students in integrated settings is the product of excess cost aid per pupil multiplied by 50 percent of the 2004-05 attendance of pupils who receive special services or programs by qualified personnel, consistent with an IEP, for 60 percent or more of the school day in a general education classroom with nondisabled students. Private Excess Cost: Aid is for public school students attending private schools for students with disabilities. Net tuition expense is multiplied by the Aid Ratio (1 -(.15 * CWR), with a .5 minimum).
- Building + Bldg Reorg Incent: Aidable building expenses are for capital outlay, leases, certain capital outlay exceptions, certain refinancing costs and an assumed debt service payment based on the useful life of the project and an average interest rate. Building Aid is equal to the product of the estimated approved building expenses multiplied by the highest of the 1981-82 through the Current AV/RWADA Aid Ratio. For projects approved on or after July 1, 2000, expenses are multiplied by the higher of the Building Aid Ratio used for 1999-00 Aid less .10 or the Current AV/RWADA Aid Ratio or, for eligible projects, the low income aid ratio. For projects approved on or after July 1, 2005 for high need/resource-capacity districts, expenses are multiplied by 0.05 multiplied by the same aid ratio used for projects approved on or after July 1, 2000, however reimbursement is limited to 98 percent, including the incentive of up to 10 percent. Up to 10 percent of additional building aid is provided for projects approved on or after July 1, 1998. For districts that have reorganized, Reorganization Incentive Building Aid is included as in permanent law. Aid is not estimated

- for those prospective and deferred projects that had not fully met all eligibility requirements as of the February 2006 database.
- Reorg. Incentive (Operating): For districts that have reorganized, Reorganization Incentive Operating Aid is included as in permanent law. The additional aid gradually tapers to zero over 15 years.
- <u>Transportation incl Summer:</u> Aid for non-capital expenses is based upon estimated approved transportation operating expense multiplied by the selected transportation aid ratio with a .9 maximum and a .065 minimum. The selected aid ratio is the highest of 1.263 multiplied by the Selected State Sharing Ratio or 1.01 (.46 * RWADA Wealth Ratio) or 1.01 (.46 * Enrollment Wealth Ratio), plus a sparsity adjustment. Aid for capital expenses is computed as above, but based on the assumed amortization of purchase, lease and equipment costs over five years, at a statewide average interest rate. Transportation Aid for district operated summer school programs is prorated to total no more than \$5.0 million statewide. Aid is provided, based on approved transportation operating expenses and assumed amortization of capital expenses and the selected transportation aid ratio, for the transportation of pupils to approved district operated summer programs.
- <u>Hardware & Technology:</u> Aid is equal to the lesser of 2005-06 expenses or Selected TAPU for Payment multiplied by \$19.25 times the Current AV/RWADA Aid Ratio.
- Software, Library, Textbook: All three aids use 2005-06 expenditures and pupil counts. The maximum Software Aid equals \$14.98 per pupil and the maximum Library Materials Aid equals \$6.00 per pupil, each multiplied by the combined 2005-06 public plus nonpublic enrollment for pupils attending school in the district plus district pupils attending full time BOCES and private school programs for students with disabilities plus pupils attending the State operated schools at Rome and Batavia and resident pupils placed in Special Act school districts. Aid cannot exceed approved expenditures. Textbook Aid equals \$42.30 per pupil for Regular Textbook Aid plus \$15 per pupil for Lottery Textbook Aid multiplied by resident public plus resident nonpublic enrollment plus resident pupils with disabilities attending approved private schools or the State operated schools at Rome and Batavia and resident pupils placed in Special Act school districts. Textbook Aid is not to exceed actual expenditures for purchase of textbooks during 2005-06. Charter school enrollments are included in the pupil counts.
- <u>Universal Prekindergarten:</u> The Universal Prekindergarten grant as claimed for 2005-06. A district is eligible to receive a grant up to the amount the district was eligible to receive in 2005-06.
- Early Grade Class Size Redn: The Early Grade Class Size Reduction grant as claimed for 2005-06.

 A district is eligible to receive a grant up to the amount the district was eligible to receive in 2005-06.
- <u>Teacher Support Aid:</u> Teacher Support grants, for the Big 5 City school districts, are the same as for 2005-06.
- Sound Basic Education Aid: The sum of 2005-06 Sound Basic Education (SBE) Aid plus an additional apportionment. The additional apportionment is the State total of \$375,000,000 multiplied by the ratio of the district's 2005-06 SBE Aid to the State total 2005-06 SBE Aid of \$324,867,141.
- Total: Sum of the above Aids.
- \$ Chg 06-07 minus 05-06: Difference between the two totals.
- <u>% Chg Total Aid:</u> Difference between the two totals divided by 2005-06 Total Aids multiplied by 100.
- <u>\$ Chg w/o Gr, Bl, Rebl, Trn, BOC, K:</u> Difference between 2006-07 and 2005-06 Total Aids excluding Growth, Building, Building Reorganization Incentive, Transportation, BOCES and Full Day Kindergarten Aids.
- % Chg w/o Gr, Bl, Rebl, Trn, BOC, K: \$ Change w/o Growth, Building, Building Reorganization Incentive, Transportation, BOCES and Full Day Kindergarten Aids divided by 2005-06 Total excluding Growth, Building, Building Reorganization Incentive, Transportation, BOCES and Full Day Kindergarten Aids multiplied by 100.

- <u>06-07 Supplemental Univ Pre-K:</u> Districts may be eligible for an additional grant for the 2006-07 school year. Up to \$50 million is available statewide to expand this program.
- <u>06-07 Add'l Univ Prekindergarten:</u> Difference between the 2005-06 Universal Prekindergarten Grant a district was eligible for and the 2005-06 grant claimed by the district.
- 06-07 High Tax Aid: Districts may be eligible for a high tax aid apportionment for the 2006-07 school year with up to \$20 million available statewide. For any district in an eligible county, aid is the greater of \$25,000 or the result of \$29.90 multiplied by 2005-06 public enrollment for State Aid. An eligible county is one in which the tax effort ratio exceeds .04000 (or 4 percent). The tax effort ratio of the county is the result of (a) the sum of the districts' 2003 residential tax levy with condominiums divided by (b) the sum of the districts' 2003 adjusted gross income.
- <u>06-07 EXCEL</u>: A total of \$2.6 billion is available for capital construction through Expanding our Children's Education and Learning (EXCEL) with the amount shown for a district computed as follows: for high Need/Resource-Capacity districts, the product of \$778.22 multiplied by the 2005 enrollment; and, for average and low Need/Resource-Capacity districts, the product of \$320.46 multiplied by the 2005 enrollment.

ATTACHMENT B

FLEX AID

[Chapter 53 of the Laws of 2005] (2005-06 Estimated Total - \$8,430.6 Million)

Flex Aid is the largest category of aid apportioned under formula aid for major districts. Flex Aid is unrestricted aid available to help each district meet its expenditures for general operation and maintenance of the school district. Included are operating expenditures such as salaries of administrators, teachers and non-professionals, fringe benefits, utilities and maintenance of school facilities.

Certain expenses are not included in the definition of expenditures for general operation, primarily because these expenditures are aided through other formulas or special aid programs. Examples of such expenses are: transportation expenses, capital outlay and debt service, expenses to Boards of Cooperative Educational Services (BOCES), tuition payments to other districts, and payments from funds received from the federal government.

<u>Selected Flex Aid</u> = Lesser of Total Flex Aid or Total Flex Aid as shown on the Executive Budget computer run BT033-1

<u>Total Flex Aid</u> = Tier 1 Flex Aid + Tier 2 Flex Aid + Aid Due Minimum Increase or Cap + Tier 3 Flex Aid

<u>Tier 1 Flex Aid</u> = Sum of 2004-05 Comprehensive Operating Aid (COA), Summer School Aid, Minor Maintenance and Repair Aid, Educationally Related Support Services Aid, Extraordinary Needs Aid and Limited English Proficiency Aid.

A portion of Flex Aid must be set aside to support the provision of services to LEP students, pursuant to certain federal and state laws and regulations.

The regional cost index used in Flex Aid is a Geographic Cost of Education Index (GCEI)-based adjustment reflecting variations in teacher compensation among school districts in New York State.

Please refer to the 2004-05 State Aid Handbook for a description of 2004-05 COA.
