HELPING AND HEALING

Many of us have been affected by the hardships of a loved one struggling with addiction.

That's why Doug has sponsored legislation to help combat drug abuse and the opioid crisis:

- Provides insurance coverage for detoxification and rehabilitation services (A.5834).
