Thanks to the efforts of Assemblymember Lavine, the seawall at Glen Cove's beloved Morgan Memorial Park will be protected from the harsh salt water of the Long Island Sound for decades to come. Lavine secured a grant to be given to the City of Glen Cove totaling \$500,000 which will be used to complete rehabilitation of the full length of the seawall including restoration of the large granite 'tea house' at the north end. In addition, the funding will allow the city to restore the three brick pavilions located at the south end of the sea wall.
