JUDICIAL DISCRETION

We can trust our judges to set bail if they see an offender has a history of breaking the law (A.4155)



EVALUATE DANGEROUSNESS

We can empower justices to consider individual and community safety when determining pre-trial release for suspects (A.4206)



PUNISH GUN OFFENDERS

Gun crimes should keep offenders off the street, which is not what New York established in 2019^a (A.632)



PROTECTING LAW ENFORCEMENT

We can label targeted crimes and graffiti against law enforcement as hate crimes (A.1159)
