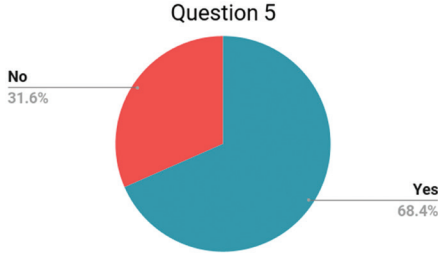
Assemblywoman Solages Releases 2023 Constituent Questionnaire Survey Results

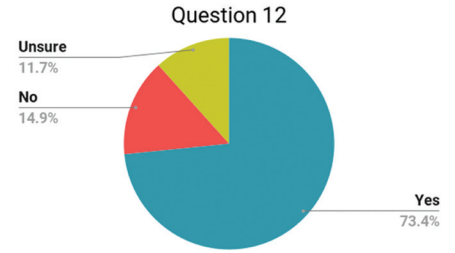
Question 5:

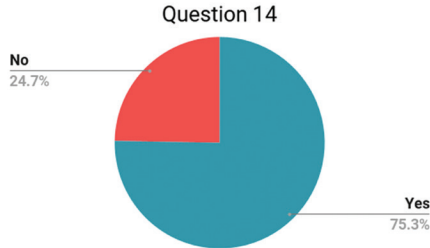
Home Heating Prices Have Been Soaring in Recent Years. Do You Support the State Limiting How Much a Utility Can Charge for Heat?

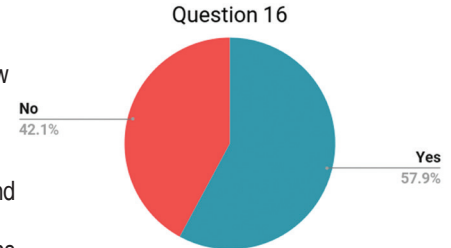
Would You Support Outlawing These Practices?
