A Message From **DAVID I. WEPRIN**

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

I hope this message finds you and your loved ones safe and well. The 2022 Legislative Session is winding down and is scheduled to conclude on June 2nd. I am pleased to report that this year we made historic investments in the next generation of New Yorkers by funding both primary and higher education, including \$1.1 billion for Universal Pre-Kindergarten and \$60 million in state operating support funds for SUNY and CUNY. Throughout the COVID19 pandemic we've relied on our hospitals and frontline healthcare workers to support us and sacrifice for our wellbeing, and this budget makes critical investments in our healthcare infrastructure. We will raise the home care worker minimum wage by \$3 over the next two years, while adding \$904 million in funding to New York's Medicaid program. We are investing an additional \$800 million for safety-net and public hospitals, and \$100 million for distressed hospitals, \$50 million of which will go to New York City facilities including Jamaica Hospital Medical Center.

Here in the 24th NYS Assembly District, my team and I are pleased to continue providing quality constituent services to all of our residents and neighbors. Together we have celebrated great successes and overcome many serious challenges. My District Offices, located at 185-06 Union Turnpike in Fresh Meadows and 111-12 Atlantic Avenue #5 in Richmond Hill, are open 5 days a week from 9am to 5pm. Welcoming Visitors in Albany from CUNY

The Legislative Office Building is always a center of activity during session, with activists and advocates for many different causes stopping by my office to chat. It is my policy that I will meet with anyone who wants to meet, and it was a pleasure to connect with representatives from my district who were fighting for greater investments in the City University of New York (CUNY) and the State University of New York (SUNY). I believe that our public colleges are a model for the rest of the country, and we made historic funding increases this year with investments including \$60 million in state operating support funds for SUNY and \$60 million for CUNY, as well as \$159 million to hire additional full-time faculty at four-year colleges and community colleges. The Assembly Majority has long been dedicated to making college affordable. This budget also increases state support in operating revenue to raise the amount campuses receive for Excelsior Scholarship recipients by \$13.7 million for SUNY state operated campuses, \$2.1 million for SUNY community colleges and \$2.8 for CUNY senior colleges, for a total of \$18.6 million.


