Since the horrific attack on October 7th and the Israel-Hamas War taking place in the Middle East, tensions and emotions are high as New Yorkers all have opinions. Our diverse population deserves to feel safe, no matter what. Unfortunately, hate crimes and threats have increased to unprecedented levels. In the 24th District alone, a Sikh man was assaulted for wearing his turban on an MTA bus and a Jewish educator at Hillcrest High School was targeted by students for her religious identity and private participation in a vigil for Israel. Antisemitism, Islamophobia, anti-Sikh prejudice, and hate crimes of any kind will never be tolerated in Queens. I have fought my entire career to protect my neighbors' religious and cultural expression, and I will continue to do so.
