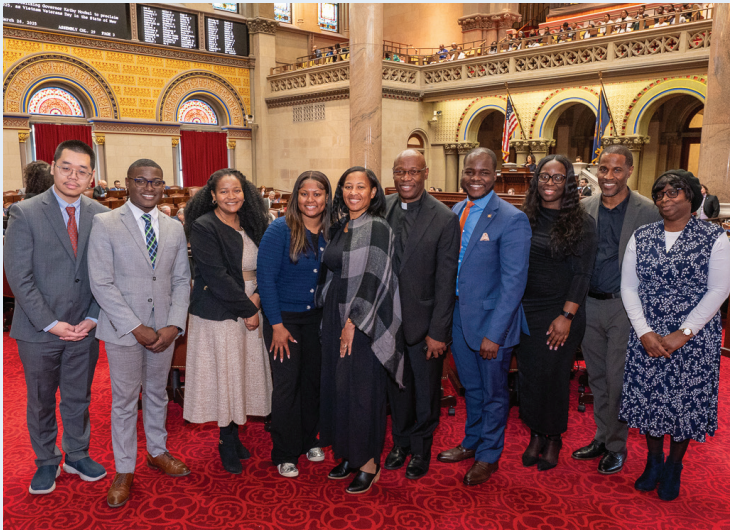
STATE OF THE DISTRICT

FOSTER YOUTH SHADOW DAY



I had the opportunity to mentor an ambitious young man from Southeast Queens, a CUNY student. This year, he played a key role in helping me introduce a bill to establish bonds for foster youth, giving them the chance to save and invest in New York's economy as they age out of the system.

SCHOOL DISTRICT 29 CIVICS DAY



I had the pleasure of joining Assembly Members Alicia Hyndman and Clyde Vanel for Civics Day, welcoming students from School District 29 to Albany. In a town hall-style Q&A, I spoke about the legislative process, the state budget, civic engagement, and shared my personal journey to inspire them to stay informed and involved in their communities.

FRANCESCO'S LAW



Earlier in March, I hosted a legislative breakfast for one of my priority bills this session, A1962A/S3385, a lifesaving bill that makes secure firearm storage, the cornerstone of firearm safety. We heard firsthand from mothers who lost their children who have turned the unimaginable tragedies into activism. It was a painful but needed reminder of the work we must do. Francesco's Law would establish a violation for the failure to securely store firearms when in the presence of minors or individuals prohibited from possessing firearms. Francesco was a 17-year-old who lost his life due to an unsecured firearm after experiencing cyberbullying.

CAUCUS WEEKEND



During Association Weekend, I hosted a workshop focused on expanding access to higher education. We addressed barriers students face in pursuing college and explored solutions to improve outreach, financial support, and pathways for diverse students to succeed. It was a valuable opportunity to collaborate with community members and stakeholders committed to increasing college access for underserved populations.

NONPROFITS ADVOCACY DAY



Everyone has ideas—we’re all entrepreneurs in our own right. Too often, nonprofits lack the tools, resources, and capacity to grow. That’s why I, alongside the Black Legislative Task Force, hosted Advocacy Day to spotlight the vital work of nonprofits driving change. By advocating for continued funding, we underscored the power of support and collective impact. The strong turnout reflected the strength and unity of our shared mission.

RIVERFUND LEGISLATIVE BREAKFAST



As the new Chair of the Food, Farm, and Nutrition Policy Task Force, I was proud to host a legislative breakfast for Riverfund, a Queens based nonprofit that does tremendous work for food insecurity. Each month they deliver 1 million pounds of food. They support communities by helping them apply for SNAP and other benefits. My hope is to continue to work together to break down these barriers for those facing food insecurity.
