 Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) Launch Queens Bus

 Network Redesign Phase 1

Please be advised that there are tons of changes within South East Queens. The MTA has launched the Queens Bus Network Redesign Phase 1. The redesigned network introduces 124 bus routes—94 local and 30 express—representing an increase of 11 new routes. This initiative is backed by a \$33.7 million annual investment in operations, aimed at enhancing service and connectivity for riders. Phase 1 officially launched on June 29, 2025, with Phase 2 scheduled to roll out on Sunday, August 31, 2025 targeting the Rockaways. This is a significant step forward for our community especially for Southeast Queens, which offers faster commute times and access to transit connections.

### Airport Concession Disadvantaged Business 🖉 Enterprise Fund



#### NEW YORK STATE OF OPPORTUNITY. & Division of Small Business & Technology Development

Empire State Development (ESD) utilizing the State Small Business Credit Initiative (SSBCI) has partnered with the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey to create the \$50 million Airport Concession Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Fund (ACDBE Fund) providing support to certified-ACDBE businesses seeking concession opportunities at the John F. Kennedy International Airport (JFK) and the LaGuardia Airport (LGA).

### How does the ACDBE Fund work?

- The fund provides \$50 million in loan capital to Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFIs) and credit enhancements to banks to support certified ACDBEs already awarded or currently seeking airport concession opportunities at JFL or LGA. Program lenders use this capital along with matching capital from other resources to offer small business loans.
- Loans range from \$500,000 up to \$5,000,000.
- Competitive interest rates, terms and fees are determined by the individual program lenders. Lenders are responsible for applications and credit decisions.

#### What can the loan funds be used for?

 Typical uses of funds are working capital, acquisition of machinery and equipment and leasehold improvements at a NYC Airport business location.

### JFK Redevelopment: Community Advisory Council & Diversity in Contracting

The Port Authority has committed to **robust** community outreach and strong participation by local and diverse businesses.

As part of its community outreach strategy, the Port Authority formed the **JFKR Community Advisory Council**, composed of local elected officials, community boards, business and academic institutions, civic and nonprofit organizations, and faith leaders.

The council meets **publicly** multiple times each year to report out on **construction progress**,

community development initiatives, upcoming events and opportunities for local residents, students, businesses, and more.

On diversity in contracting, the Port Authority has adopted a **nation-leading 30% M/WBE participation goal**. To monitor compliance on the JFK Redevelopment Program, the agency has retained **third-party consultants** from the local community. The consultants review participation data to ensure its **accuracy and reliability**. They also generate **public reports** that are posted to the program website monthly.

ROSEDALE Quality of Life Concerns Frequently Asked Questions by Homeowners/Residents

### Loud Music - Backyard Parties

Q: My neighbor plays loud music at their backyard parties all the time. Is this a violation of the NYC noise code? Should I talk to my neighbor about the noise?

A: YES. NYC noise codes and regulations prohibit excessive and unreasonable levels of noise that disturbs the peace. Be mindful that if done politely and respectfully, having a conversation with your neighbor may eliminate the noise problem.

### Q: What if talking does not accomplish anything. Who should I call to report a noise complaint?

A: All non-emergency noise complaints should be made to 311; they will direct your complaint to the New York City Police Department (NYPD). The NYPD takes service requests to those noise complaints when they are not handling emergencies. The officers will be able to take action if the noise is still happening when they arrive

### Q: How late can music be played outside?

A: To avoid disturbing your neighbors, use common courtesy and lower or end the music by 10 pm.

### Abandoned/Derelict Vehicles

### Q: There is an abandoned car parked on the street that has not been moved for days. What can I do?

A: You can call 311 and report an abandoned vehicle. Unless a posted sign says otherwise, you may not park a car over (7) days in a row in the same spot. Before involving the police, first check with your neighbors to ascertain the vehicle's owner. Officers from the police precinct will respond and investigate, when they are not handling emergency situations. The department of sanitation will respond, investigate and tag the vehicle. Once it is tagged, it will be removed within (3) business days. The vehicle owner will be responsible for all towing and storage fees.

### **Dirty Sidewalks**

Q: Who is responsible to clean the sidewalks and curbs on my street?

A: Homeowners must clean sidewalks adjoining to their property. Homeowners are responsible to clean (18) inches from the curb into the street. Litter and debris must be picked up and deposited in suitable containers with lids for garbage collection. Recycling should be separated from regular garbage. Electronics should be deposited at retail drop off sites and not with regular garbage.

## FIGHTING FOR YOU AGAINST ILLEGAL CANNABIS SHOPS AND SALES

Since November 2022, joint enforcement operations have resulted in the prosecution of over 440 individuals for felony-level charges related to the sale and/or possession of cannabis or controlled substances in Queens County. In that same time, the following items below have been seized from over 400 suspected illegal cannabis dispensaries in Queens County, with an estimated value of more than \$25 million. The DA's office will also initiate eviction proceedings to permanently close illegal cannabis shops.

### **EVIDENCE RECOVERED**

- Over 7,000 lbs. of cannabis edibles, including gummies and candy bars
- Over 12,000 lbs. of cannabis flower
- Over 18,000 cannabis vape "pens"
- Hundreds of packages of edible psylocibin, also known as "magic mushrooms"
- Also recovered from these locations: loaded firearms, tasers, stun guns and knives

### WHAT TO DO IF YOU BELIEVE A BUSINESS IS AN ILLEGAL SMOKE SHOP

- Notify the NYPD and the Queens DA's office and we will take action.
- Know that, even after an investigation, a court-authorized search, removal of contraband and/or an arrest has been made – this does not immediately close the store.
- . This is the first step in the legal process to allow us to initiate the eviction proceeding.
- Please know that DA Katz is committed to closing down as many illegal cannabis dispensaries as possible.

### MELINDA KATZ WELCOME CHANGES TO DISCOVERY

It was my honor to join Governor Kathy Hochul as she announced an agreement with State Legislative leaders to make essential changes to existing discovery laws.

The 2019 changes to discovery – the requirement that prosecutors share evidence with defense attorneys in a timely manner – were the right thing to do, but there have been unintended consequences: cases are taking longer, dismissals have increased, and victims are being harmed.

Working with my fellow district attorneys, we presented our state leaders with a trove of data that showed that our discovery laws needed to be updated.

These negotiated changes to the discovery statute will help preserve the rights of the accused, improve public safety and protect victims.

I thank Governor Hochul, Assembly Speaker Carle Heastie and Senate Majority Leader Andrea Stewart-Cousins for finding common ground on New York's discovery laws.

Our state has the most transparent discovery laws in the United States and these changes will safeguard that designation.

### TRI-STATE AREA BUSTED

A prolific car theft ring was dismantled, and 20 individuals were indicted on various charges including enterprise corruption, grand larceny and criminal possession of stolen property last month.

This crew allegedly stole more than \$4.6 million worth of cars and motorcycles – including BMWs, Hondas, Mercedes-Benzes and Land Rovers – throughout the New York City area and beyond.

The arrests were the result of a three-year investigation by the DA's office, the NYPD and the New York State Police and included undercover operatives who were able to buy 44 of the 126 cars that had been stolen.

Many of the stolen vehicles were swiped from city streets, while others were taken from the driveways of car owners – sometimes unlocked with the keys or key fobs inside.

The theft crew also used high-tech methods to steal cars, including using a handheld device to access the car's diagnostics system, which enabled them to program new key fobs to drive the cars away. After stealing the cars, the crew allegedly

After stealing the cars, the crew allegedly disabled vehicle navigation systems and were adept at disposing of any tracking devices that rightful owners placed in their vehicles. The cars were then sold to brokers who

The cars were then sold to brokers who allegedly advertised the stolen vehicles on social media, including Instagram and Facebook. The defendants quickly flipped cars without altering the vehicle identification numbers. In addition to the cars, undercover investigators also bought three firearms from the alleged culprits, including a semi-automatic rifle.

DA Katz said that her office, along with law enforcement partners, will methodically investigate, prosecute and dismantle auto theft rings operating in Queens County.

#### HOW TO PROTECT YOUR VEHICLE

 Get a Car Diagnostic Port Lock: This is a special lock that will block access to the diagnostic port that is used when you get your car serviced. Savvy criminals use this port to program new key fobs and drive away with your vehicle. A port lock will slow down and dissuade car thieves.

 Use a traditional anti-theft device: Remember the steering wheel bars? They are still excellent deterrents. They're easily visible to would-be thieves and require a great deal of effort and time to disengage.

 Lock your car: Remember to never leave your key or key fob in the car. Never leave the vehicle's engine running, even if you expect to be away for mere seconds.

### WHAT IS DEED FRAUD?

Deed fraud occurs when someone files an unauthorized deed, mortgage or other lien against a property without the consent or knowledge of the homeowner. Anyone can be victimized, but seniors, immigrants and people of color are often targeted.

Victims can and have lost their homes. With the help of the city Register's Office at the Department of Finance you can take action to protect yourself.

### **REGISTER FOR FRAUD ALERTS**

Check your home's property records annually and sign up to be notified if a document – new deed, mortgage, etc. – is recorded with the city against your property. After you're registered, the city will contact you or your designated representative if a new document is filed.

If you believe you are a victim of deed fraud, call the NYC Sheriff's office at (718) 707-2100 or the DA's Housing and Worker Protection Bureau at (718) 286-6673.

## Protecting Yourself From SOUATERS

Homeownership is part of the American dream, but unfortunately bad actors and fraudsters are continually inventing ways to defraud people out of their homes.

We at the Housing and Worker Protection Bureau are working hard to hold accountable those who would steal someone's home. However, the best protection is prevention so we would like to share with you some helpful information.

### WHAT IS A SQUATTER?

A squatter is a person who enters and remains in your home without permission or authority to be there. A squatter will try to look and act like a person who has a right to be there, but they don't.

### HOW IS A SQUATTER DIFFERENT FROM A TENANT?

A tenant is someone who at some point had permission to live in the home. They may be paying rent or have stopped paying rent. They may also have been allowed to stay in the home by another tenant with or without the landlord's permission.

A squatter never had permission to enter or stay in the home. Think of a squatter as burglar who never leaves.

### IF YOU ARE THE VICTIM OF SQUATTERS (DO ALL THREE OF THESE):

- Call the police immediately.
- Retain an attorney experienced in landlord/tenant matters.
- Call the Queens District Attorney at (718) 286-6673.

### SIMPLE STEPS YOU CAN TAKE TO PROTECT YOURSELF FROM SQUATTERS:

- Confirm the title to your home—check the status of your deed with the NYC Department of Finance.
- Maintain your home and property so it doesn't look abandoned—mow the lawn, clean up trash etc.
- Make sure the neighbors know the status of the house and who is responsible for it.
- Keep the lights on using timers and motion sensors.
- Leave a car in the driveway or allow a neighbor to do so.
- Get a security camera or video doorbell.
- Regularly inspect the property and document the condition of the property with pictures and video.
- Put up no trespassing signs.
- If the owner of the house has died, have a family meeting about what to do with the property as soon as possible.
