Vaccines

- **Children under 5 can now receive the COVID-19 vaccine**

Both the Moderna and Pfizer vaccines have been authorized by the FDA for children 6 months to 4 years old.

- **You may be eligible for your second booster shot**

If you are over age 50 or immunocompromised, you are eligible to receive your second booster shot, as long as it has been 4 months since you received your first booster.

- **8 free COVID-19 tests are available per household**

All households are eligible for 8 rapid antigen COVID-19 at-home tests, which will be delivered by the USPS. If you would like to order them by phone, call **1-800-232-0233** to get help in more than 150 languages. You can order them online at: <https://special.usps.com/testkits>

- **Free rapid PCR tests are available**

You can make an appointment for a free Rapid PCR test at NYC COVID Express sites. Test results are available within 24 hours of your visit. You can make an appointment online at: <https://on.nyc.gov/3Px0EIX>

- **COVID-19 treatments are available for free, even without insurance**

If you test positive, there are free treatment options available, including antiviral pills and monoclonal antibodies. Call your health care provider to ask about treatment options. - **Pick up free tests at our office from August 29 - September 2**
