#### **ASSEMBLYMAN RON KIM CARES DEEPLY ABOUT OUR VETERANS**

Assemblyman Kim's dad was a marine who fought in the Vietnam War with American soldiers. It was during this time when Ron's dad grew a deep appreciation of the American democratic system and decided after the war to pursue the "dream" himself. To this day, Assemblyman Kim feels passionate about always giving back to the veterans who have sacrificed to uphold and spread the values of this great nation. That is why Assemblyman Kim is especially proud to have voted for a state budget this year that included \$350,000 for the Veterans Entrepreneurial Assistance Program to provide veterans the training they need to start a new business. This is just a small token of appreciation of our veterans' hard work and sacrifice.



### 2015 LEGISLATIVE BUDGET IN DEPTH

#### **Protecting Children and Teachers**

We fought tooth and nail to achieve concessions that will continue to let local districts determine the effectiveness of our teachers based on student growth, not just standardized testing. Through tough negotiations, I rejected the executive's unrealistic teacher evaluation plan that amounted to an attack on teachers.

#### **Investing in Education**

We voted to secure \$9.2 billion for New York City Schools, which is about \$500 million more than last year; \$75 million in grants for struggling schools; and \$20 million in grants for libraries, teacher centers, and bilingual education.

#### **Helping the Elderly**

In an effort to help the poor and elderly, we voted to restore \$78.9 million to Medicaid, and \$10.7 million to preserve spousal refusal, which protects couples from losing their life savings in the event that a spouse requires long-term care.

#### **Expanding Affordable Housing**

The budget provides \$415.6 million for housing and community development programs, allotting \$225 million for repair and rehabilitation programs. It also provides \$34.7 million for community development programs and \$155.5 million for other af-

#### **Cracking Down on Corruption**

By requiring greater disclosure, transparency and accountability, this year's state budget makes a series of ethics reforms to help restore the public's trust in government. The state budget requires public officials to disclose outside income they receive from non-government employment on their annual financial disclosure forms.

#### **Fighting for Better Healthcare**

The final budget also rolls back the governor's shortsighted cuts and makes a strong commitment to vital public health programs, including a \$21.3 million restoration for 39 discrete health programs that would have had their funding cut by 15 percent.
