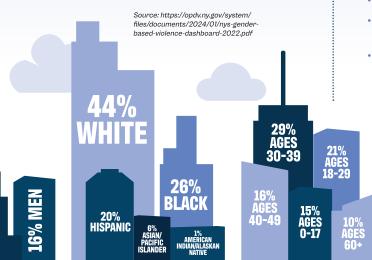

Types of abuse:

• Physical, Emotional, Sexual, Financial, Stalking

Recognizing some of the signs of domestic abuse:

- Feeling scared of how your partner may behave.
- The use of intimidation or threats to gain compliance from you.
- Treating you roughly-grab, push, pinch, shove or hit you.
- Pressure you sexually for things you aren't ready for.
- Threatens to hurt you, the children, your family or your pets.
- Withholding access to money, and/or forbidding attendance at school or employment.

Always remember:

- · NO ONE deserves to be abused.
- . The abuse is NOT your fault.
- DON'T worry if you do not speak the local language. We can get you help in many languages.
