The Staten Island Hunger Task Force held its 9th Anti-Hunger legislative breakfast to bring awareness to the thousands of food-insecure families on Staten Island and growing concerns of cuts to SNAP benefits. - Beginning on March 1, 2020, a new bag waste reduction law will take effect in New York State. All plastic carryout bags (with limited exceptions) will be banned from distribution by anyone/business required to collect New York State sales tax. In NYC all businesses covered by the ban will be able to charge a \$0.05 fee on paper bags. I encourage shoppers to BYOBag- Bring Your Own Bag to avoid any frustrations and help the health of our communities by reducing our plastic use. With the help of NYC Sanitation, my office will provide free reusable bags that will help you avoid fees while shopping and support the effort to reduce waste!
