

5 Ways to Make Your Vote Count:

You can register, re-register and make address changes at many state and local offices serving the public, including the departments of Labor, Social Services, Motor Vehicles, and state and city universities. Voter registration applications are available at: www.elections.ny.gov/votingregister.html.

1. 17-year-olds can register if they will reach their 18th birthday by the end of the calendar year.
2. If you need to change your name and/or address, use the voter registration form to submit these changes.
3. If you need an absentee ballot, go to your county board of elections or download the online form here: <http://www.elections.ny.gov/VotingAbsentee.html>.
4. You can also register as an organ and tissue donor on the form.

This is a big election year for New York!
Here's what you need to know:

September 13, 2016 is the **State and Local Primary**.
The last day to register to vote in this election is on
August 19, 2016.

The **General Election** is on **November 8, 2016** and the last day
to register to vote in this election is on **October 14, 2016**.

The right to vote is a cornerstone of our democracy. Yet recently, this right has been jeopardized. Assembly Member O'Donnell believes in the power of a person's right to vote and has been a strong supporter of transparency and expediency in voting and in ending voter disenfranchisement. Assembly Member O'Donnell understands the need for legislative reforms to fix a flawed system and has the record to prove it.

Key Legislation Assembly Member O'Donnell has voted for in the NYS Assembly:

A.7634 – A bill sponsored by Assembly Member O'Donnell allows people on parole to vote, ending their voter disenfranchisement and encouraging reintegration into our communities.

A.9108 – A bill cosponsored by Assembly Member O'Donnell consolidates the federal non-presidential and state primary dates so voters can vote for these primaries in a single day.

A.10370 – Expedites online voter registration, making it easier for more people to vote.

A.3389 – Simplifies the ballot layout and content so that it's easier to understand.

A.8608 – Helps poll sites run more effectively with computer registration.

A.10712 – Allows counties to change qualifications for voting to best serve their populations and eliminates the potential for discriminatory qualification changes.
