Alex stands firm in supporting fair pay, benefits, and conditions for all workers.



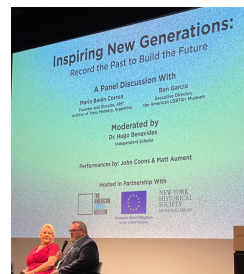

Assemblymember Bores witnessed the signing of Assembly bill A01709 into law by Governor Hochul.

He co-sponsored this bill, which protects doctors in New York providing telehealth services to patients in states where abortion is restricted or banned. Alex's great-grandmother, Mary Gigi, died because abortion was illegal; we cannot return to those dark days.
