PASSING LEGISLATION

Assemblymember Bores' 'Click to Cancel Act' passed unanimously (149-0). This bill ensures that New Yorkers can cancel subscriptions or automatic charges through the same method they used to sign up—eliminating the hassle of online subscriptions requiring cancellations by phone or mail. The final version will be determined as part of the budget process.
