

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Now in Effect: Infertility Legislation

Introduced by Assemblymember Bores, a new law ensures New Yorkers with cancer can access fertility preservation services through Medicaid. Effective October 1, it eliminates uninsured costs when patients must choose between life-saving treatment and preserving fertility. The program represents just 0.005% of total State Medicaid spending and will not raise overall rates, but will allow some New Yorkers to start families that were previously impossible.
