At least 85 new coronavirus deaths and 10,257 new cases were unfortunately reported in New York on December 10. Over the past week, there has been an average of 10,048 cases per day, an increase of 72 percent from the average two weeks earlier. As of Monday, December 14, indoor dining is on a pause in New York City.

On Tuesday, we were joined by leaders in the field of higher education to discuss the changing college applications and admissions process in the era of COVID19. This week on Town Hall Tuesday we will host a virtual "Know Your Rights" training at 7:00pm on Facebook live. Join us to learn about your rights in public utilities, unemployment, and housing.

Roosevelt Islanders can get tested this weekend on Saturday, December 12th, and Sunday, December 13th at a free COVID-19 mobile test site! Testing will be available on a first-come, first-serve basis, from 8 AM - 7 PM at Good Shepherd Plaza at 543 Main Street.

This holiday season we are collecting new and unwrapped books, toys and board games for the families and children of the New York Center for Children serving the victims of child abuse. Consider dropping off a new and unwrapped gift to our community office at 1485 York Avenue (78/79 Streets) by Monday, December 14.

## Cutting the Ribbon on a New Community Pantry



On Thursday, the Upper East Side welcomed a new Urban Outreach Center location dedicated to feeding and caring for the neighborhood's residents most in need. The ribbon-cutting ceremony was attended by members of the Eastside Taskforce for Homeless Outreach and Services members, including Avenue Church NYC Senior Pastor the Rev. Beverly Dempsey, Urban Outreach Center Executive Director the Rev. Jordan Tarwater, and ETHOS taskforce members including Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright, Council Member Ben Kallos and Senator Liz Krueger.

The new site features a supermarket-style food pantry allowing individuals the comfort of being able to choose from available foods, just as if it were a regular supermarket. This was done intentionally to add dignity and a sense of normalcy for people receiving fresh produce and other healthy staples from the food pantry. The Urban Outreach Center is a new 501(c)3 nonprofit, created from the historic homeless services mission of Avenue Church NYC, formerly Jan Hus Presbyterian Church, which is now located at 1745 First Avenue.

"As a member of the East Side Task Force for Homeless Outreach and Services, I am proud to welcome a new Urban Outreach Center location dedicated to helping our neighbors in need. As the weather gets colder, we all need a place to seek refuge for a hot meal and warm clothing. We are amidst a global pandemic and take for granted the common warning: "stay inside, stay at home." For some, they cannot yield that warning to protect themselves from this public health threat. We are so fortunate to be unveiling this resource for our neighbors with the most need," said Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright.

Both the Urban Outreach Center and Avenue Church are members of East Side Taskforce for Homeless Services, combining the efforts of the local faith-based and non-profit organizations, electeds, and city agencies to help homeless individuals off the street and to the services they require.

#### **Outdoor Dining Winterization**

The NYC Department of Transportation (DOT) has issued *additional guidance for Open Restaurants* to make all roadway seating areas as safe as possible this winter. Sandbags, reflector tape, snow sticks, and plastic barriers will be available to all participants, free of charge. Participating restaurants will be emailed with distribution and pickup detail. In addition, the City is ready to help program participants with any questions and is deploying a team of inspectors to help owners and managers understand new and existing requirements. #### NYC Small Business Resource Network

To accelerate the recovery of small businesses, the *NYC Small Business Resource Network* offers free, personalized, one-on-one assistance for small business owners.

#### **Commercial Lease Program**

#### **Travel Advisory**

New York State's COVID-19 Travel Advisory outlines guidelines for anyone traveling into New York State. This includes New Yorkers who have traveled to other states or countries, as well as people visiting New York. Non-essential travel is strongly discouraged. Indoor and outdoor gatherings at private residences are limited to no more than 10 people under NY State Executive Order 202.74. Social distancing, face covering, and cleaning and disinfecting protocols are *required by the NYS Department of Health*.

#### Toy Drive

Governor Andrew M. Cuomo announced New York's annual statewide holiday donation drive to benefit families in need and will now accept shipped donations of new unwrapped toys, coats and school supplies at two locations to assist community-based organizations during the holiday giving season.
