COVID-19 Booster Shots

Pfizer Vaccine Approved To Booster Eligible Groups

Monitor the <u>CDC's Website</u> and <u>nyc.gov/covidvaccine</u> for updates as additional guidance is released from the federal government

If you got Pfizer:

Pfizer booster doses are now available for certain groups of people who received the Pfizer vaccine at least six months ago. Those groups are:

- People who are 65 or older
- People who are 18 or older with an underlying medical condition, or
- People who are 18 or older and live in a nursing home or other long term care facility.
- People who are 18 or older at higher risk of COVID-19 exposure due to occupational (e.g. healthcare workers) or institutional setting (e.g. people who live in shelters)
- Eligible New Yorkers can access booster shots starting today (9/24) and will need to attest to their eligibility
- Additionally, there has been no change to the August guidelines about third
 doses for people with underlying conditions. Adults who received the Pfizer
 vaccine at least 28 days ago, and are <u>moderately to severely</u>
 <u>immunocompromised</u>, are still eligible for a third dose of the Pfizer vaccine,
 as part of their initial vaccination series. Eligible New Yorkers can access third
 doses citywide and need to attest to their eligibility.

If you got Moderna:

- People who received Moderna are not eligible for a booster shot at this time.
- However, there has been no change to the August guidelines about third
 doses for people with underlying conditions. Adults who received the
 Moderna vaccine at least 28 days ago, and are <u>moderately to severely</u>
 <u>immunocompromised</u>, are still eligible for a third dose of the Moderna
 vaccine, as part of their initial vaccination series. Eligible New Yorkers can
 access third doses citywide and need to attest to their eligibility.

If you got Johnson & Johnson

 People who received the J&J vaccine are not eligible for additional doses of the vaccine at this time.

Seawright Unified With Neighbors In Opposition to City Planning Commission's Approval of 340- Foot Tower Proposal

Moving to City Council In Next Step Of City's Land Use Review Process

"I am distressed by the decision made by the city planning commission. This decision flies in the face of our united and vocal community. I stand with the community in opposition of the blood center tower," said Seawright.

Assembly Member Seawright urges the City Council to oppose The New York Blood Center (NYBC) at 310 East 67 Street Longfellow Real Estate Partners LLC plan to demolish its existing building and replace it with a massive 334-foot-tall commercial tower. The behemoth NYBC complex would be nearly five times higher than currently allowed under New York zoning laws.

Seawright rallied with over 300 neighbors this summer, and has delivered testimony

before the Manhattan Borough President and submitted testimony to the the City Planning Commission to express the community's opposition to the planned tower located directly across from St. Catherine's Park and six schools in the Julia Richman Educational Complex. The tower would cast a large shadow over St. Catherine's Park, rendering the playspace dark for most of the day.

"The New York Blood Center project is antithetical to the needs of a residential neighborhood. The tower would exist in an already densely populated and trafficked area and would bring up to 2,500 daily employees to its streets," said Seawright in her testimony to the City Planning Commission.
