Honored Ten "Women of Distinction"
During 7th Annual Women's History Month Celebration**





To commemorate Women's History Month, Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright honored 10 women leaders of distinction for their achievements, noteworthy contributions, and outstanding work on behalf of the community on the Upper East Side, Yorkville and and Roosevelt Island.

"Every March, we celebrate Women's History Month to remember the remarkable women who have fought to give the next generation a better future," Assembly Member Seawright said. ***"To the Women of Distinction, we say congratulations! You are an enduring inspiration to our entire community, our beloved city, and our great state of New York!"***

Seawright's seventh annual Women of Distinction Awards ceremony was webcast live on Zoom and Facebook on Monday evening. Holly Buchanan, author of *Selling Financial Services to Women – What Men Need to Know and Even Women Will Be Surprised to Learn*, offered remarks as featured guest speaker

The 2022 Women of Distinction honorees are:

Flor de Maria Eilets is a 30-year resident of the Upper East Side, works in the Lower East Side as a Licensed Clinical Social Worker at Betances Health Center.

Mary Nell Hawk is a passionate advocate for free open water rowing for all on the East and Harlem Rivers as a member of the East River C.R.E.W. (Community Recreation & Education on the Water) since 1999.

Carol Grocki Lewis is a faculty member of the 92nd Street YM-YWHA Art Center's ceramic program, where she is a Teaching-Artist at the Center for Arts Learning Leaders, in which she has brought the joys of working with clay to numerous children in K-9 public schools in East Harlem. She is also the Founder and Director of the Yorkville Holiday Exhibit & Sale, now in its 10th year, at the Church of the Holy Trinity on East 88th Street.

Kim Moscaritolo spent 20 years working in television news before moving into the nonprofit world. She currently works as the Director of Communications and Digital Outreach for Hunger Free America. She also serves as a Democratic District Leader, working to help elect Democrats here in New York and around the country.

Shirley L. Mow, an educator, has worked with foundations, corporations, businesses, and local

government and nonprofit organizations to develop, fund, and implement programs to support minority students and encourage girls to study S.T.E.M. fields.

Joan Roth was a pioneer in uncovering the problem of homelessness among women. She photographed and interviewed many women who lived on the streets in the 1970s, a time of little interest and virtually no understanding of what was happening to these women.

Brenda Sauer has lived and worked on the Upper East Side for over 35 years. She moved to the neighborhood to work at New York-Presbyterian hospital as a nurse and is now the Director of Patient Access. She is also an active volunteer, working with Holy Trinity Church to prepare their community suppers and the Carl Schurz Park Conservancy, where she has co-chaired the very popular Halloween Howl for many years!

Tricia Shimamura is a mom, a social worker, a proud Japanese Puerto Rican, and a dedicated community leader who has served her neighbors on the Upper East Side and Roosevelt Island for over a decade. Tricia now serves as the Director of Community Affairs at the Manhattan Borough President's Office. In addition to serving on the East 72nd Street Neighborhood Association and being a previous board member to Friends of the East River Esplanade.

Betty Cooper Wallerstein is the Organizer and President of the East 79th Street Neighborhood Association.

Rebecca Weintraub was born and raised in A.D. 76, where she now represents Part A as District Leader. She's an active community member, fighting for our parks, schools, libraries, and so much more. She has also served as the Vice President of the East River Democratic Club.

Funding A New Deal For CUNY

Governor Kathy Hochul's budget proposals for CUNY and SUNY represent a significant shift in the State's budgetary priorities. She recognizes the vital role these two great institutions of higher education play in educating the workforce, preparing graduates for exciting careers and ensuring greater opportunities for service to the community and research to create knowledge. The Governor's emphasis on funding for full-time faculty, community colleges, childcare, and part-time TAP for example move in the right direction. She has flatly ruled out tuition increases, thus helping to avoid the increased burden on students and their families, while further adjusting financial aid availability.

The current budget negotiations give us the chance to build on the progress thus far and move more quickly towards a new deal for CUNY and SUNY. With the support of labor, students, and community leaders, our collective voices are very clear: both systems need more full-time faculty, expanded mental health and academic advisement counselors, graduate student support, services for students with disabilities, special opportunity programs like SEEK and College Discovery, community college aid, and critically, capital construction such as a new and urgently needed Hunter College nursing facility.

We must invest in the future of our city and state. There's no better way to do that than to support a well-funded CUNY and SUNY. We know that has never been sufficiently the case in past years. We all know that college graduates live and work in New York and help pay the taxes for many decades that support valuable services across the board. The time to speak up and act is now--before the budget negotiations are concluded.

Queensboro Bridge - Urgent Repairs - Saturday, March 26th



Due to a recent incident when the shielding over the lower level was struck by an over height vehicle, urgent repairs are needed for the protective shielding. To carry out these repairs, one Queens-bound lane on the lower roadway will be closed from 12:30 a.m. to 5:00 a.m. on Saturday, March 26th. This Queens-bound Lane closure will be in addition to the ongoing lane closures on the upper level. One Queens-bound Lane will be available on the upper and lower level during this closure.



Roosevelt Island Main Street Paver Repair & Resetting
