It has been a productive start to the budget season in the Assembly. This week there was a hearing on Transportation and I took the opportunity to question MTA Chairman and CEO Lieber regarding the stalled installation of OMNY readers at the Roosevelt Island Tramway.

We are working hard to ensure that funding for a sustainable workforce for Individuals with Developmental Disabilities (I/DD) is a priority in this budget. As Chair of the People With Disabilities Committee, I joined a press conference and rally to urge our governor to invest \$15 million and to make the Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) available for students with disabilities so they can succeed and thrive while pursuing higher education and their dreams.

We welcome the advocates for the I/DD workforce to Albany this Monday, February 13 to strategize around the proposal for an 8.5% Cost Of Living Adjustment (COLA) and a Direct Support Wage Enhancement for non-profits providing essential care. Let us know what your priorities are for this budget!

Our office is partnering with Project Cicero to collect books for kids in under-resourced classrooms in New York City through March 8. Please consider donating your new or gently-used grade school books to our collection at the district office 1485 York Avenue, between 78 and 79 Streets.

Seawright Spoke At Students With Disabilities Higher Education Press Conference In Solidarity With NYS Students



Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright said, "Over 86,000 students with disabilities are pursuing higher education in New York State. Institutions of higher education should be accessible and experiences in the classroom to learners of all backgrounds. I proudly stand beside my colleagues in the Legislature in solidarity with students with disabilities and their families. We need to ensure that all higher education students in New York are eligible to qualify for TAP grants – and that includes students with learning disabilities. We must meet the unfulfilled promise that every college or graduate student in the Empire State can reach their full potential, which the Legislature and the Governor can help achieve by honoring the Regents' request for full State funding of \$15 million for enhancing supports and services for postsecondary success of students with disabilities."

# An Advocate For People With Disabilities, Seawright Cosigns Letter to Roosevelt Island Operating Corporation to Pause Rate Hikes



Seawrights office has been engaging the Roosevelt Island Residents Association (RIRA), attended its meeting last week to discuss the issue. This week, cosigning a letter with Manhattan Borough President Mark Levine and other elected officials to RIOC President Shelton Haynes regarding this issue. The letter asked for a pause on implementing a fare increase and consider a more gradual approach to give impacted members of the community more time to plan financially and become familiar with the

new payment structure.

As far back as 1991, Roosevelt Island disabled residents were allowed to park free at the Motorgate Garage, but not any longer. Without any prior notice from the Roosevelt Island Operating Corp (RIOC), invoices were received last month by disabled residents informing them that their Motorgate Garage parking fees were increasing from zero to \$125 per month.
