This week I hosted a constituent in the Capitol at a press conference on the federal workers day of action with terminated federal workers against DOGE cuts. It was a pleasure to have one of my constituents in Albany to discuss her personal experience as one of the employees who were a part of the mass firings. Dr. Kelsey Hopland was doing critical research at the National Institute of Aging as a researcher for Alzheimer's disease and related dementias when she was let go. This is a setback not just for the employees but for the scientific breakthroughs that may never be discovered as a result of the dismantling of federal research infrastructure. That is why I am cosponsoring the RECOURSE Act and BRIDGE Act to help New York fight for federal funds and recruit fired federal employees.

Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright Stands With Federal Employees Against DOGE Cuts



On Wednesday, Assembly Member Seawright spoke at a press conference on the federal worker day of action with terminated federal employees at the State Capitol. These politically driven layoffs targeted scientists, public health workers, and civil servants across the country and in New York. More than 200,000 jobs across the United States have been lost, putting essential government functions at risk. Among those affected are scientists like Seawright's constituent Dr. Kelsey Hopland, who is a leading Alzheimer's researcher benefiting more than 426,000 New Yorkers living with the disease. That work has now been suspended, and the research on Alzheimer's disease will be set back by years. Research, prevention, and disease tracking are stalled and will lead to public health emergencies.

"I am proud to speak at a press conference with my constituent Dr. Kelsey Hopland and other impacted federal workers against draconian and indiscriminate cuts of thousands of federal employees," said Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright. "These jobs are saving the lives of everyday Americans, and in her case, at the National Institute of Health for those living with Alzheimer's and other dementias."

- original, signed social security card
- W2 or 1099 with full social security number, or
- ineligibility letters issued within 30 days

Two documents providing NYS residency, such as:

- valid NYS ID
- bank statement
- utility bill, or
- pay stub displaying your current address

New Good Cause NYC Website Launched

At <u>GoodCauseNYC.org</u>, a brand-new website, NYC tenants can enter their address and answer a short set of questions about their apartment to determine if their unit is eligible for protections, and access resources to fight back against an unjust rent hike or lease nonrenewal. The site also includes a rent increase calculator to help renters determine if their rent hike is considered "unreasonable" by the law.




