ASSEMBLYMEMBER CHRIS BURDICK: DELIVERING FOR OUR COMMUNITIES

» Nearly \$3 billion for child care to expand eligibility for subsidized care and better support working parents



» \$1.1 billion for the Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) and Landlord Rental Assistance Program (LRAP)



» Accelerated the state middle-class tax cuts resulting in the lowest rates in 70 years for taxpayers with a combined income between \$27,900 and \$323,200



» \$250 million to help New Yorkers pay back utility bills
» \$585 million to suspend the state gas tax through the end of the year



» \$35 million for the Homeowner Protection Program (HOPP) to help New Yorkers at risk of foreclosure stay in their homes



» \$22 million for the Hunger Prevention Nutrition Assistance Program



» \$4.2 million for the Nutrition Outreach & Education Program (NOEP) to help those facing food insecurity



» \$3,000 bonus payments to qualified full-time frontline health care workers and an increase to the home care worker minimum wage by \$3 over two years
