Harmful Algal Blooms ("HABs") are the rapid growth of algae or bacteria in freshwater lakes, ponds, rivers and streams that can harm people, animals and the environment. When algal blooms grow out of control, they produce toxic or harmful effects that can make you or your pets sick. Stay away from the water if it looks discolored, has scum or smells bad. Assemblyman Slater helped sponsor legislation classifying HABs as a water contaminant and sponsored the Harmful Algal Bloom Monitoring and Prevention Act.¹
