In Case You Missed It - Budget Update

State budget negotiations are still underway, and I am continuing to push for top priorities like funding for our roads, schools, and more. If you have not already seen my latest message regarding the Assembly's one-house budget and the specifics of what we are pushing for, <u>click</u> <u>here to read it</u>.

Though the Assembly one-house budget did not include a specific line item for funding for the next phase of 9A modernization, I am also continuing to advocate for \$20 million dollars for the next engineering phase of this project. Note that multiple options for construction are still being considered; <u>click here to find the 9A study report</u>, which details options under consideration. Securing this funding now would not commit us to one particular option over others. Note also that this year's <u>planned repaving of sections of Route 9A</u>, scheduled to begin in June, will proceed

regardless of the outcome of this year's state budget negotiations; the funding for this project has already been secured.
