Assemblyman Zebrowski is happy to announce that he was able to secure funding for various projects and infrastructure upgrades throughout the Town of Haverstraw:

- Road paving is often a necessary, yet expensive task. Ken was happy to be able to secure funds to go toward paving across different areas of the Town that Supervisor Phillips and Board identified as most in need of repair.
- He was also successful in securing funding for the Highway Department for the purchase of a new truck and radios.
- Assemblyman Zebrowski has partnered with Supervisor Phillips in providing state grants for the construction for the planned Town recreation center.

There are many exciting projects going on in the Village of Haverstraw that Assemblyman Zebrowski has been able to collaborate on:

- Working together with Mayor Kohut and Village Officials, Ken and his daughter Reagan recently gathered to unveil the new nautical themed playground at Emeline Park that he contributed toward the construction of.
 - State grants helped support the purchase of playground equipment and surfacing.
 - This state-of-the-art playground replaces 20+ year old equipment and is now ADA accessible.
- In addition to the playground, Assemblyman Zebrowski also helped provide funding for:
 - A new "Jaws of Life" for the Fire Department
 - Security cameras and generators for pump stations
 - Necessary paving on State Street, Hillside Ave, and Broadway

The Village of West Haverstraw continues to provide necessary infrastructure upgrades for residents:

- Ken successfully secured funding for the milling and repaving of Samsondale Avenue
- In addition, the Village was able to resurface the roller rink at Samsondale Park
- A project that Assemblyman Zebrowski is honored to work on with Mayor D'Amelio and Leo Laders Post 130 Commander Don Joachim is the Calico Hill War Memorial on Railroad Avenue
 - Over the years, various monuments have been damaged or have simply aged and are in need of repair.
 - In addition to these repairs, funding that Ken has provided will include upgrades that will improve the experience of ceremonies as well as increased privacy for visitors and more space for future medallions.
 - As restoration plans are being finalized, Assemblyman Zebrowski looks forward to working with the Village to ensure that this is a memorial that is reflective of the community's appreciation of our veterans.

Much Needed Paving Along State Route 202:

- Earlier this fall, the Department of Transportation (DOT) announced that a \$3.3 million project has begun in the Town to improve eight intersections along Route 202.
- In addition to resurfacing, enhancement will be added to the corridor including new left-turn lanes, updated traffic signals, new crosswalks, and sidewalk ramps.
- DOT is also planning on repairing the stone retaining walls and will construct a new sidewalk on the South Side at the Rosman Road intersection to accommodate a new bus shelter that the County is installing.
- These investments will help to make the roadway safer, increase pedestrian access, and enhance the flow of traffic. Although this is positive progress, Assemblyman Zebrowski will be pushing for expanded repaving work along the entire stretch of 202. Much needed improvements are still necessary and the Assemblyman plans on working with DOT to make this a reality.
