2026 Constituent Survey Responses

Respondents' overall support for the legislation included in the survey was strong, ranging from approximately 80% to 92% support for each bill. Feedback from this survey helped Assemblyman Wieder focus on what legislation to craft and support to make a real difference in the 97th District.

Constituent Survey Results — Legislation Feedback

LEGISLATION INCLUDED IN THE SURVEY

- ✓ **A.10465** – Require all public service commission proceedings to offer a virtual participation option to allow more citizens to engage in the policymaking process.
- ✓ **A.403** – Establish a more robust and streamlined clemency process, requiring the Governor's Office to publish reports on clemency applications and establish expedited reviews.
- ✓ **A.5786-B** – Prohibit utilities from shutting off electric or heat services when the temperature is forecast to reach 85 or higher or 32 degrees or lower, protecting residents during extreme weather.
- ✓ **A.3090** – Create a purple alert system to notify the public of missing victims of domestic violence and unify the response across state agencies.
- ✓ **A.1038** – Add Lyme and other tick-borne diseases as occupational health threats for the purpose of workers' compensation and require health insurers to cover long-term care for these diseases.

WIEDER MEETS WITH DISTRICT COMMUNITIES



Memorial Day Parade

Veterans, first responders, elected officials and community members gathered for the annual Sparkhill Memorial Day Parade honoring the brave men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice while serving our country.

St. Patrick's Day Parade

Assemblyman Wieder joined 2026 Rockland County Grand Marshal Pat Withers at one of New York's largest parades, the annual Saint Patrick's Day Parade in Pearl River. Organized by the Rockland County Ancient Order of Hibernians, the event welcomed participants and spectators from across the county and gave everyone the opportunity to celebrate and support local businesses.



Mobile Office at New Square Community Day

At the village's community day, Assemblyman Wieder hosted a mobile office to deliver essential services to residents in their community. His office coordinated with the Department of Motor Vehicles to help residents apply on-site for state IDs and driver's licenses. Other participating agencies included the state Comptroller's Office, American Red Cross and the Rockland County Clerk's Office.



Clover Stadium Food Distribution

Assemblyman Wieder joined The Regional Food Bank Hudson Valley and TOUCH-Together Our Unity Can Heal, Inc., along with dozens of dedicated volunteers, at Clover Stadium for a large-scale community food distribution serving families across Rockland County. Together, they distributed more than 30,000 pounds of fresh produce and essential groceries to over 400 families, helping address the growing need for food assistance in the community. The event was part of an ongoing collaborative effort with local nonprofit partners to combat food insecurity and ensure that families have access to healthy, nutritious food during challenging economic times.



Rockland Business Association Luncheon

Assemblyman Wieder joined fellow state officials at the Rockland Business Association (RBA) General Membership Luncheon to participate in a moderated discussion on critical statewide issues. Assemblyman Wieder emphasized his constituent-driven approach to legislative work and his strong commitment to supporting local businesses.



A Discussion with Area Highway Superintendents

Assemblyman Wieder met with area highway superintendents, including Orangetown Highway Superintendent James J. Dean, to discuss road and bridge maintenance, infrastructure funding and emergency preparedness.

Funding for MLK Multi-Purpose Center
