NYSERDA Sunrise Wind Project



Lieutenant Governor Brian Benjamin and the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority announced the largest, single offshore wind supply chain contract award in New York State to support the NYS Sunrise Wind offshore wind project. Ørsted and Eversource, Sunrise Wind's joint development partners, signed a \$86 million supply chain contract with Riggs Distler & Company, Inc. to construct advanced foundation components for wind turbines at the Port of Coeymans, bringing construction and steel manufacturing work to New York companies in the Capital Region.

NYS COVID-19 Pandemic Small Business Recovery Grant Program Webinars

Dates for the NYS COVID-19 Pandemic Small Business Recovery Grant Program webinars have

been scheduled for the month of October.

The New York State COVID-19 Pandemic Small Business Recovery Grant is a grant, not a loan, meaning that you do not have to pay back the funds!

The New York State COVID-19 Pandemic Small Business Recovery Grant provides financial recovery assistance to for-profit small businesses that were in operation on or before March 1, 2019, who can demonstrate a minimum 25% loss in gross receipts between their 2019 and 2020 tax returns and have gross receipts between \$25,000 and \$2,500,000 on their 2019 or 2020 tax returns.

Grant awards are based on gross receipts for 2019. Newly expanded eligibility criteria has made more NYS business eligible for the grant:

- Annual gross receipts: \$25,000 \$49,999.99: Award is \$5,000/business
- Annual gross receipts: \$50,000 \$99,999.99: Award is \$10,000/business
- Annual gross receipts: \$100,000 \$2,500,000 [UPDATED 08.25.21]: Award is 10% of gross receipts (maximum grant is \$50,000)

<u>NYS Attorney General announces that the Capital Region will receive \$32 million in Opioid</u> <u>Settlement Funds</u>



Earlier this week I joined New York State Attorney General Tish James and our government partners to announce that \$32 million will be committed to the Capital Region to combat the opioid epidemic.

I would like to express my gratitude for a job well done by the New York Attorney General as it relates to the agreements reached with the large multinational players that were involved in fueling the opioid and heroin crises. As one of the few practicing professionals in health care that is a member of the Legislature, I am keenly aware of the practices that fueled the crisis and, as a former mayor and current legislator, I am even more familiar with the impacts this crisis has had on individuals, their families, and our communities. The up to \$1.5 billion secured by Attorney General James will be spent wisely and appropriately in the areas of education, treatment, and recovery in accordance with opioid settlement lockbox legislation I sponsored to make sure there is a dedicated fund for the money secured. As much as money will not bring back the lives lost nor heal the pain suffered, I am confident that appropriate use of the funding will help prevent more deaths and pain for many families.
