

Assemblywoman Woerner believes that every child deserves a quality education that sets them on a path toward a bright future. That's why she has secured more than \$400,000 in additional funding in 2018 and 2019 to help the Fort Edward school remain open and continue to serve students.

Improving local libraries

In this digital age, libraries continue to serve as critical community hubs that help residents access a variety of resources, including the internet. Assemblywoman Woerner helped secured \$5,000 for the Fort Edward Free Library to upgrade its technology and keep residents connected.

Boosting public safety
