

# Assemblywoman Woerner: Supporting our communities



## Funding local medical services

- Investing in critical medical infrastructure ensures local families have access to the care they need in an emergency.
- Assemblywoman has committed to providing \$250,000 to the Moreau EMS to aid in the ongoing construction of a new building.
- She also secured \$10,000 for the Moreau Emergency Squad to purchase an ambulance computer.



## Enhancing community resources

- Assemblywoman Woerner secured \$125,000 for the Town of Moreau to assist in the construction of a universally accessible playground at Harry Betar Park.
- In 2017, Woerner secured \$25,000 in additional funding for local schools to help ensure every student has the resources and support they need to succeed.



## Repairing local infrastructure

Maintaining the infrastructure of a community is crucial to its continued success. To address aging sidewalks throughout South Glens Falls, Assemblywoman Woerner secured \$125,000 for ongoing repair projects.



## Supporting law enforcement

Assemblywoman Woerner helped provide the South Glens Falls Police Department with \$5,000 to purchase eight new portable radios and two new office chairs.
