Family Planning Opening New Medical Center in Cortland

Family Planning of South Central New York has opened a new medical clinic in Cortland, located at 165 S. Main Street within the Family & Counseling Services location. The center fills a critical need for family planning and reproductive health services that the Cortland area lacked.

From Family Planning: "The new clinic will operate four days a week, offering a full range of both urgent and non-urgent gynecological and reproductive health care services, including birth control, annual exams, UTI testing and treatment, cancer screenings, STI testing and treatment, and rapid HIV testing and rapid Hepatitis C testing."

REMINDERS:

PUBLIC FORUM FOR NYSEG COMPLAINTS

The New York State Department of Public Service (DPS) and Consumer Advocate "are seeking public comment regarding alleged billing, meter reading, and customer service issues affecting customers of New York State Electric and Gas Corporation (NYSEG)." Your input of any difficulties you have experienced are critical in the investigation of the company's overall service performance in the state.

While the virtual public forums and public hearings have passed, you can still <u>submit a written comment</u> to be part of the investigation. Our district input is critically important to hold them accountable for service issues, such as:

- Delayed or un-received bills
- Bills based on estimates rather than meter readings
- Issues with renewable energy credits/billing reconciliation
- Customer service experiences and delays in service
