Rethinking Waste in Tompkins County


Tompkins County has released its Draft Local Solid Waste Management Plan (LSWMP), titled *Rethinking Waste in Tompkins County: Fostering a Local Circular Economy*. I had the opportunity to attend the public meeting, listen to concerns of our community, and share a little about my PFAS Disclosure Act, which requires the identification and reporting of PFAS at publicly owned treatment facilities. PFAS, or forever chemicals, continue to be a collective concern, but we cannot intervene if we do not know where they are coming from.

Thank you to the county staff and community members for their extensive work on the plan, and I applaud their efforts to move us away from single-use materials and toward building a circular economy. I encourage you to watch a recording of the public meeting, read the plan, and participate in the public comment period. 

I appreciated the information shared by keynote speaker Dr. Damien Helbling in his presentation, *How Is PFAS Affecting Our Drinking Water*, and the opportunity to connect with local groups working to protect our lake and water systems. As the event concluded and the sun set over

our beautiful Cayuga Lake, I was reminded of how interconnected our freshwater systems are, how the health of our water impacts the health of thousands of New Yorkers, and how critically important this work is.



Americans with Disabilities Act Anniversary

This week on July 26, we celebrate the 33rd anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act. This important civil rights law prohibits discrimination against individuals with disabilities in all areas of public life, including jobs, schools, transportation, and all public and private places that are open to the general public. The New York Assembly <u>passed a series of legislation</u> on Disability Awareness Day earlier this year to continue to support New Yorkers with disabilities.
