2019 Constituent Survey Results



Thank you to everyone who participated in my 2019 Constituent Survey. Knowing your opinions helps me better serve you in Albany.

I'd like to take a moment and let you know some of the results of the 2019 survey and how they were turned into action. As always, being open, honest and accountable is something I take very seriously.

One of the biggest legislative victories of this past year included **making the Child Victims Act law**, which the vast majority of respondents supported *(Ch. 11 of 2019)*. The long overdue law allows more victims of childhood sexual abuse to seek justice and face their abusers in court. And after being passed by the Assembly for over a decade, we also finally **made the Gender Expression Non-Discrimination Act (GENDA) a reality** to protect the rights of transgender and gender-nonconforming New Yorkers *(Ch. 8 of 2019)*. This measure was supported by a majority of respondents. Harsh drug policies upend lives and needlessly send people to jail for low-level offenses, especially in communities of color. To help right these historic injustices, I helped pass legislation to **decriminalize possession of small amounts of marijuana and expunge records of those charged with lowlevel possession**, which was widely supported in the survey (*Ch. 131 of 2019*).

I also passed a state budget this year that included critical criminal justice reforms, such as **expanding the Rape Shield Law against sex trafficking crimes**. Our work is far from complete, though. I'll keep working for reforms that ensure fairness and equality for all.

A few other survey highlights include support for **making the** entirety of student loan payments tax deductible, investing in more job training and workforce development programs in the fight against poverty, as well as support for additional school resource officers. I've co-sponsored legislation to create a New York State school resource officer program to keep our schools and students safe (A.6456).
