# Assemblymember Pamela J. Hunter is working for you

Throughout her time in the Assembly, Hunter has secured funding for:

## Liverpool Central School District – \$157,521

2018: To construct new playgrounds at Elmcrest and Nate Perry elementary schools

## Village of Liverpool Cemetery – \$250,000

2016: Reconstruction of roadways within the village cemetery as well as enhancing signage within the site and stabilization of the stone retaining wall along Tulip Street

## Town of Salina – \$111,595

2018: To install a sidewalk between Sun Harbor Drive and the Liverpool Elementary School to help ensure children can walk to and from school safely

## Liverpool Free Library – \$6,000

2016: For a mobile book bike

## Huntington Family Centers – \$17,942

2016: To replace the pre-K and day care playground and install new equipment

## City of Syracuse – \$500,000

2017: For road restoration and resurfacing on Onondaga Ave. between Bellevue Ave. and Centennial Drive

## Onondaga County War Memorial – \$500,000

2017: For renovations of the Veterans Assembly Hall, a new scoreboard, LED screens and outdoor marquees

## Syracuse Jazz Fest – \$11,333

2017: Programming for free community concert festival and scholastic education opportunities

## Onondaga Central School District – \$500,000

2016: Project is currently in progress to add a bus stop and new curbs to the junior and senior high school drop-off locations (\$428,000) and for Payton's Place, an outdoor classroom program named for a young girl who passed away (\$72,000)

## AccessCNY – \$149,900

2018: To install energy efficient windows, replace HVAC controls, upgrade elevator, asbestos abatement, parking lot resurfacing and for new paint and carpeting

## Ophelia's Place – \$10,000

2016: New kitchen equipment to support the café attached to Ophelia's Place, a support center for those with eating disorders

## Boys & Girls Clubs of Syracuse – \$125,000

2018: To install a new roofing structure and two roofing furnaces and rehabilitate the entrance

## CNY Jazz Central – \$20,000

2017 & 2019: For CNY Jazz Central to provide programs to underserved constituencies via its public and scholastic programs

## City of Syracuse Parks Department – \$13,168

2017: Baseball equipment for the Inner City Little League

## Syracuse Educational Opportunity Center – \$22,500,000

2018 & 2019: To help fund various projects on campus

## Town of DeWitt – \$141,000

2017: To support Feldmeier Equipment's expansion of the Brooklawn Parkway Extension

## DeWitt Sidewalk Project – \$125,000

2016: Town of DeWitt sidewalk project on Thompson Road

## Dunbar American Legion Post 1642 – \$17,912

2016: Overhaul to kitchen, replacement of roof soffits and the completion of repairs

## Park Hill School – \$275,000

2016: To make the bus circle and drop-off location more accessible and safe (\$100,000) and to install a new roof (\$175,000)

## East Syracuse Elementary School – \$25,000

2016: To install an outdoor protective barrier around the playground

## Village of East Syracuse – \$268,000

2018: To repair the roof of the Village Municipal Building

## East Syracuse-Minoa Central School District – \$32,100

2016: To create STEM Makerspaces

## City of Syracuse – \$155,000

2017: For repairs to the public safety building support columns

## CenterState CEO – \$600,000

2018-2020: To support the multi-year economic development strategy for the Gateway Development Partnership on the South Side

## CNY Arts – \$5,000

2019: Dasher's Magical Gift ticket scholarships and production costs

## Syracuse City School District, Adult & Continuing Education – \$9,149

2017: iPads with cart and charging station

## City of Syracuse – \$168,680

2017: To install Criminal Observation and Protection System (COPS) cameras on the South Side of Syracuse

## City of Syracuse – \$285,320

2018: To install Criminal Observation and Protection System (COPS) cameras on the South and West sides of Syracuse

## Westcott Community Center – \$6,350

2017: Funds were used for two high-efficiency air conditioner units

## Fortune Society – \$250,000

2018 & 2019: To help fund Freedom Commons, a supportive housing unit for formerly incarcerated individuals

## Brady Faith Center Farm – \$7,545

2019: To help the farm provide nutritious food, jobs and educational opportunities to the community

## Mercy Works – \$156,900

2016: To replace the roof
