In honor of their 150th Anniversary Celebration on Sept. 12, 2021, I presented University United Methodist Church with an Assembly Citation commemorating this milestone. University United Methodist Church is dedicated to continuing work – individually and in partnership with the city, neighbors and others – to address need in their urban corridor and to growing as a faith community dedicated to feeding God's people – body, mind and spirit. University Church has a long history as a visible and vocal advocate for social justice and for putting faith into action in service to its urban neighborhood, to the city and more.



## Syracuse and Onondaga County Fire Museum

I toured the Syracuse and Onondaga County Fire Museum, which was partially built in the 1800s, on Oct. 15. I was able to see the many antique firetrucks and firefighter memorabilia and learn the history of the fire station where the museum is located on the city's Northside.

## Upstate Cord Blood Bank Tour

I toured the Upstate Cord Blood Bank on Sept. 16 and learned more about the importance of cord blood donation. Upstate Cord Blood



Bank is the region's only public cord blood donation center and is dedicated to saving and improving lives through the use of donated cord blood. They are a local, not-for-profit, public donation center for women who choose to give the lifesaving gift of cord blood. Umbilical cord blood is rich in stem cells and has been shown to have a beneficial value in fighting against blood cancers such as leukemia or lymphoma and as many as 80 other life-threatening diseases.



## Girl Scout Award Recognition

I joined Assemblyman William B. Magnarelli to honor eight Bronze Award Girl Scouts from Junior Troop 10427 on Nov. 29. The Bronze Award is one of the Girl Scouts' highest

honors and requires a minimum of 20 service hours per scout. Projects included building pig shades for Purpose Farm in Baldwinsville, which was devastated last December because of a fire at the farm, and designing a new letterbox course at the Girl Scout Camp in Tully at Hoover Adventure Center. The girls wrote the clues, mapped out the course and built new clue boxes and holders. I was happy to present the awardees with Assembly Citations and Medals of Distinction.

## Winston Gaskin Homes Ribbon-Cutting

I joined the Winston Gaskin Homes ribbon-cutting on Oct. 25. Winston Gaskin is the Housing Visions' and YWCA of Syracuse's first preservation project that includes substantial

rehabilitation of 20 buildings of their original early projects, which resulted in the construction of 66 new housing units. This is a \$22 million project on Syracuse's Eastside and Northside.

## Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP)

HEAP can help you stay warm this winter! New Yorkers can now apply for the regular HEAP benefit and the emergency benefit.

The Clean and Tune Benefit can also provide eligible households with up to \$400 to clean or repair primary heating equipment. Eligibility and benefits are based on income, household size, primary heating source and the presence of a household member who is under age 6, age 60 or older or permanently disabled.

## Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program

The Ombudsman Program is seeking compassionate and dedicated volunteers to become certified long-term care ombudsmen in Onondaga, Oswego, Cayuga and Cortland counties.
