• **H**azard Branch Library used a \$10,000 grant secured by Assemblyman Magnarelli to make the library even more welcoming to the many patrons who visit each day.

“Onondaga County Public Library’s Hazard Branch is a great resource to many on the West side of Syracuse. It offers opportunities to learn, hold meetings, and become involved in the community,” said Assemblyman Magnarelli. “This grant allowed the library to make improvements that would have been put on hold in this economy.”

New carpeting and 64 new stackable chairs were purchased for the library’s community room. The area is used as a meeting room for children and adults, including the Savvy Speakers Toastmasters, Mommy & Me, a communications group from Syracuse University, a 4-H club, and art groups.

In addition, the library reupholstered a sofa and five chairs. The seating provides an informal setting for library users to read newspapers, magazines, books, use laptops with wireless internet and to meet quietly with friends.

“We are grateful for the grant which has allowed us to purchase new items and upgrade our furniture, so we can make the library as comfortable as possible for patrons,” said Olivia Opello, Hazard Branch Library Manager.
