# **On the State Level...**

All not-for-profit applicants must now pre-qualify on the NYS Grants Reform Website at <u>grantsreform.ny.gov/grantees</u> to apply for certain New York State grant solicitations. Potential not-for-profit applicants are strongly encouraged to begin the process of registering and pre-qualifying immediately, as this is a lengthy process.

### NYS Dept. of Education, Mentor Teacher Internship Program

The NYS Mentor Teacher Internship Program enables experienced teachers (mentors) in a district or BOCES to provide guidance and support to beginning teachers (interns) in their first and/or second year of teaching.

- Eligible Applicants: Public school districts, BOCES programs
- Deadline: May 10, 2023, 5 PM ET
- **Total Funding Available:** \$10 million total; annual funding is expected to be \$2 million, subject to the appropriation and availability of funds

# **On the Federal Level...**

#### US Dept. of Health and Human Services, National Strategy for Suicide Prevention

These grants will help implement suicide prevention and intervention programs for adults - with an emphasis on older adults, adults in rural areas and American Indian adults. This program is intended to address the **2021 Surgeon General's Call to Action** – a broad-based public health approach to suicide prevention by enhancing collaboration with key community stakeholders (e.g., county health departments, workplace settings, criminal justice settings, senior-serving organizations, community firearm stakeholders), raising awareness of the available resources for suicide prevention and implementing lethal means safety.

Eligible Applicants: Eligibility is statutorily limited to a community-based primary care or behavioral health

care setting, an emergency department, a state mental health agency (or state health agency with mental or behavioral health functions), public health agency, a territory of the United States or an Indian tribe or tribal organization (as the terms "Indian tribe" and "tribal organization" are defined in section 5304 of title 25).

- **Deadline:** May 15, 2023
- **Estimated Number of Awards:** 5
- **Estimated Total Program Funding:** \$2 million
- **Award Ceiling:** \$400,000

### US Dept. of Justice, Upholding the Rule of Law and Preventing Wrongful Convictions (ROL/WCR)

The ROL/WCR program supports efforts by wrongful conviction review entities (WCR entities) that represent individuals with post-conviction claims of innocence to review individual cases.

- Eligible Applicants: Public and state controlled institutions of higher education; city or township governments; private institutions of higher education; nonprofits having a 501(c)(3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education; Native American tribal organizations (other than federally recognized tribal governments); nonprofits that do not have a 501(c) (3) status with the IRS, other than institutions of higher education; county governments; county, state or local public defenders that have in-house post-conviction representation programs that show demonstrable experience and competence in litigating post-conviction claims of innocence; Native American tribal governments and state governments
- **Deadline:** May 17, 2023
- Expected Number of Awards:
  - Category 1 Wrongful Conviction Up to 8 awards
  - Category 2 Prosecutor/ Conviction Integrity Unit-Led Partnerships with Wrongful Conviction Review Entities – Up to 8 awards

#### US Dept. of Health, Health Careers Opportunity Program (HCOP)

These grants assist students from disadvantaged backgrounds to enter and successfully complete health profession schools.

 Eligible Applicants: grants assist students from disadvantaged backgrounds to enter and successfully complete health profession schools.

- **Additional Information on Eligibility:** Eligible applicants include accredited schools of medicine, osteopathic medicine, public health, dentistry, veterinary medicine, optometry, pharmacy, allied health, chiropractic and podiatric medicine; public and nonprofit private schools that offer graduate programs in behavioral and mental health; programs for the training of physician assistants; and other public or private nonprofit health or educational entities able to carry out the activities of the program, including community colleges, technical colleges and tribal colleges. Pursuant to the statutory authority, nursing schools and programs are not eligible to apply for this funding opportunity. Eligible entities must be located within the 50 states, the District of Columbia, Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Commonwealth of Northern Mariana Islands, the U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa, the Republic of Palau, Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the Federated States of Micronesia.

Individuals and nonprofit organizations (film archives, educational institutions, media arts centers) are eligible to apply for grants of up to \$10,000 for the preservation or restoration of American films from any era in which women have held significant creative positions, including but not limited to writer, director, producer, editor and performer.

# Folded Flag Foundation, Educational Scholarships

Educational scholarship and support grant opportunities are offered to the spouses and children of United States military and government personnel who died due to hostile action or in an accident related to U.S. combat or stateside military operations. These opportunities include educational scholarships for Gold Star children in K-12 to cover the cost of private school tuition and fees, tutoring, afterschool programs, summer camps and/ or other related educational expenses; and educational scholarships for Gold Star spouses and/or children to cover the cost of college, trade school or graduate school, including the cost of tuition and fees, books, computers, living expenses, tutoring, test preparation services and/or career preparation expenses.

- Eligible Applicants: The spouse or child (ages 5 to 26) of a U.S. military member or government employee who lost his or her life due to hostile action or an accident related to U.S. combat or stateside operations.
- **Deadline:** May 12, 2023
- Available Scholarships:
  - Children's Education Scholarship: For eligible children in grades K-12, The Folded Flag Foundation provides scholarships and educational grants to cover private school tuition and fees, tutoring, afterschool programs, summer camps and other related educational expenses.
  - College or Technical/Trade School Scholarship: For college-bound\* spouses and children, The Folded Flag Foundation provides scholarships and educational grants to cover tuition and fees, books, computers, living expenses (to include childcare for students with young children), tutoring, test preparation services and career preparation expenses (internships, resume writing workshops, interview preparation training, etc.).
    - \* "College-bound" refers to public and private colleges and universities, as well as technical institutes and trade/vocational schools.
  - The General Montgomery (Monty) C. Meigs Scholarship: The General Montgomery (Monty)
    C. Meigs Scholarship is awarded to an individual who demonstrates the outstanding characteristics of Monty Meigs. This individual excels both in the classroom and on the field and strives to help others through selfless service.

- Eligible Applicants: The director(s) of a submitted film must be a student who was enrolled (full-time or parttime) in a degree-granting program at an eligible school when the film was made.
- **Deadline:** June 1, 2023
- Awards: Gold, silver, and bronze medal awards (which include cash grants of \$5000, \$3000 and \$2000, respectively) may be given by the Academy of Motion

Picture Arts and Sciences in recognition of outstanding achievements in student filmmaking in each of four categories: Narrative, Documentary, Animation and Alternative/Experimental.
